AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; APPROPRIATING \$572,658.00 IN ANNUAL EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT ("ESG") FUNDING FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT TO FUND VARIOUS SERVICES AND ACTIVITIES AIMED AT ADDRESSING HOMELESSNESS AND THAT MEET THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE ESG PROGRAM, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 24-004; PROVIDING AUTHORIZATION FOR REALLOCATION OF GRANT FUNDS AS MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

21 Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, 22 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated 23 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) 24 listed in subsection (b):

The funding above is an appropriation of \$572,658.00 in 1 2 annual grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") for the Emergency Solutions Grant 3 ("ESG") program. The City is required to match ESG funds 4 5 with an equal amount of cash and/or non-cash contributions which may include donated buildings, materials, 6 and 7 volunteer services. The City accomplishes this match requirement through programs and funding provided by the 8 9 Social Services Division of the Parks, Recreation and 10 Community Services Department. The ESG program grant funds must be expended within 24 months after HUD signs the grant 11 12 agreement.

Section 2. The purpose of the appropriation in 13 Purpose. Section 1 is to provide funding for services and activities aimed at 14 15 addressing homelessness and that meet ESG program goals and 16 objectives. This includes activities and services that: i) engage 17 homeless individuals and families living on the street; ii) improve the number and quality of emergency shelters for homeless individuals 18 19 and families; iii) help operate these shelters; iv) provide essential 20 services to shelter residents; v) rapidly re-house homeless 21 individuals and families; and vi) prevent individuals and families 22 from becoming homeless. A portion of the ESG funds will be used for costs associated with administration of the ESG program. The Schedule 23 24 of Proposed Funding detailing the proposed uses of ESG funds is 25 attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this 26 reference. A copy of the grant award letter from HUD is attached hereto as **Exhibit 3** and incorporated herein by this reference. 27

28 Section 3. Authorization for Reallocation of Grant Funds. 29 In the event a sub-recipient is unable or unwilling to accept an 30 award of ESG funds, the funds may be reallocated to the next eligible 31 awardee using the same method and criteria normally applied by the
