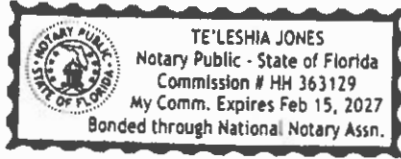

Obituary of A.B. Coleman, Jr.

Dr. Andrew Brooker (A.B.) Coleman, Jr., elder of three children was born to Dr. Andrew B. and Susie Jenkins Coleman, Sr. on the campus of Bethune Cookman College in Daytona Beach, Florida, January 12, 1930.

He is the product of the public schools system of Jacksonville, Stanton Class of 1946; Benedict College; Howard University School of Religion, Urban Institute; Luther Rice Seminary; numerous military schools during a 20-year military career; and American Academy McAllister Institute of Mortuary Science.

After retiring from the U.S. Army, Dr. Coleman began a new career in funeral service, becoming a partner in the Johnson & Jenkins Funeral Home, Inc., in Washington, D.C. Upon returning to Florida in 1972, he organized a very successful funeral practice, A.B. Coleman Mortuary and Cremation Service, Inc.

He is active in religious and civil affairs:
