Bill Summary: This bill confirms the Mayor's appointment of Daniel L. Henry, to the Public Service Grant Council, replacing Kami Richardson for a first full term to expire on December 1, 2025.

(Note: will need to be amended in committee the name of the person being replaced is Kami Richmond, and the term end date should be 12/31/25)

Background Information: The Public Service Grant Council is established pursuant to Chapter 80, *Ordinance Code*, and charged with the review and evaluation of all Public Service Grant applications and responsibility for making funding recommendations to the Mayor and City Council for Public Service Grants.

Section 80.102, *Ordinance Code*, provides the Public Service Grant Council shall consist of 15 voting members, eight of whom shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by City Council and seven of whom shall be appointed by the City Council President and confirmed by City Council. Members of the Public Service Grant Council shall be chosen to provide community diversity and knowledge of needed services; shall demonstrate an interest in the impact of public service programs in the community, and a willingness to participate fully in the Public Service Grant application process. A minimum of two Mayoral appointees and two City Council appointees shall have prior experience with grant processes.

Mr. Henry is a vendor relationship administrator for Citizens Property Insurance Corporation, and he worked previously as a paralegal for FIS. He serves as a member of the TRUE Commission and the Election Advisory Panel. Mr. Henry resides in Duval County in council district 7.
