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28 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

29 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2023-2024 fiscal year,  
30 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated  
31 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)

10 appropriation from the Opioid Settlement Fund -  
11 Miscellaneous Settlements account to the Opioid Settlement  
12 Fund - Subsidies and Contributions to Private Organizations  
13 account to fund Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants for  
14 Fiscal Year 2023-2024.

15 **Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in  
16 Section 1 is to provide additional funding for Opioid Settlement  
17 Proceeds Grants to be awarded to qualified requesting agencies in  
18 Fiscal Year 2023-2024 in accordance with Chapter 84 (Opioid Settlement  
19 Proceeds Grants), *Ordinance Code*. This funding comprises 70 percent  
20 of the total opioid settlement proceeds deposited in the Opioid  
21 Settlement Special Revenue Fund created by Section 111.265, *Ordinance*  
22 *Code*, as of July 1, 2023.

23 **Section 3. Amending Sections 84.301 (Opioid Settlement**  
24 **Proceeds Allocation for Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants) and 84.307**  
25 **(Funding Allocations by OSUD Grants Committee; Grant Award**  
26 **Limitations), Part 3 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grant Awards**  
27 **Procedures), Chapter 84 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants),**  
28 ***Ordinance Code*.** Sections 84.301 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds  
29 Allocation for Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants) and 84.307 (Funding  
30 Allocations by OSUD Grants Committee; Grant Award Limitations), Part  
31 3 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grant Awards Procedures), Chapter 84

(Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants), *Ordinance Code*, are amended to read as follows:

**CHAPTER 84 - OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANTS**

**PART 3. - OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANT AWARDS PROCEDURES**

**Sec. 84.301. - Opioid Settlement Proceeds Allocation for Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants.**

The City of Jacksonville shall make an initial appropriation to the OSUD Grants Committee in an amount equal to 40 percent of total Opioid Settlement Proceeds deposited in the Opioid Settlement Special Revenue Fund created by Section 111.265, *Ordinance Code*, as of July 1, 2023. Thereafter, on or before April 1 of each year, the Finance and Administration Department shall calculate the total Opioid Settlement Proceeds deposited in the Opioid Settlement Special Revenue Fund during the immediately preceding calendar year. The annual funding amount for Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants shall, at a minimum, be equal to ~~40~~ 70 percent of the total Opioid Settlement Proceeds deposited in the Opioid Settlement Special Revenue Fund during the immediately preceding calendar year. This appropriation shall be included in the Mayor's proposed annual budget for the upcoming fiscal year. The Opioid and Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee shall not award or allocate funding to requesting agencies under this Chapter until after the City Council has approved the annual budget ordinance. Any Opioid Settlement Proceeds appropriated to the OSUD Grants Committee for Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants that are not awarded or that remain unencumbered at the end of a fiscal year shall not be returned to the Opioid Settlement Special Revenue Fund but shall carry forward to the next fiscal year for subsequent award by the OSUD Grants Committee. The City appropriation for the next fiscal year shall not be reduced by the amount of any unencumbered or unawarded residual funds from prior fiscal years.

**Sec. 84.307. - Funding Allocations by OSUD Grants Committee; Grant Award Limitations.**

(a) *Limitations on Grant Awards.* Individual grants within each Opioid Settlement Proceeds funded category shall be based on the high score model for funding purposes. The high score model shall award 100 percent of requested funding for the highest-ranked score up to the maximum amount of ~~\$250,000~~ \$500,000. The next highest-ranked score shall be awarded 100 percent of the requested funding up to ~~\$250,000~~ \$500,000 and so on until the funds are exhausted.

**Section 4. Grant Application Deadline for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Grant Cycle.** Requesting agencies shall have through December 18, 2023, to submit a grant application for the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 grant cycle.

**Section 5. Requesting One-cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 (Declaration of Emergency), Part 9 (Emergency Legislation), Chapter 4 (Procedures).** One-cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the Opioid and Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee is currently in the process of receiving grant application submittals for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and need to notify requesting agencies of the increased award limitation amount and the additional grant funds provided herein.

**Section 6. Codification Instructions.** The Codifier and the Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and division "tables of contents" consistent with the changes set forth herein. Such editorial changes and any others necessary to make the *Ordinance Code* consistent with the intent of this legislation are approved and directed herein, and changes to the *Ordinance Code* shall

1 be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

2 **Section 7. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become  
3 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective  
4 without the Mayor's signature.
