ORDINANCE 2023-832-E

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR 6 AN AND 7 CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT 8 WITH JACKSONVILLE UNIVERSITY FOR THE 9 CONTINUING MANATEE PROTECTION STUDIES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024, WITH UP TO FOUR ANNUAL 10 RENEWALS, SUBJECT TO APPROPRIATION BY CITY 11 COUNCIL; SECTION 126.107(G), 12 INVOKING ORDINANCE CODE, TO EXEMPT THIS PROCUREMENT 13 FROM COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION AND BIDDING FOR 14 SAID CONTRACT; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE 15 PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING 16 AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 17

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19 WHEREAS, over the last many years the City of Jacksonville 20 has engaged Jacksonville University to provide marine science 21 support, particularly in developing and refining the City's Manatee 22 Protection Plan; and

23 WHEREAS, the University's Gerard Pinto, Ph.D., a 24 highly-regarded expert on marine mammals, especially manatees, is 25 currently the principal scientist under the contract with 26 Jacksonville University; and

27 WHEREAS, effective on September 11, 2018, the City Council 28 approved legislation, Ordinance 2018-540-E, authorizing the City to 29 enter into a contract with Jacksonville University for supporting a 30 manatee protection plan in the St. Johns River; and

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WHEREAS, subsequently, from October 1, 2018 through September

30, 2022, the City of Jacksonville entered into amendments to the
 contract, exercising renewal options in Ordinances 2019-645-E,
 2020-588-E, 2021-718-E and 2023-54-E; and

WHEREAS, Jacksonville University has compiled a comprehensive
database for the Duval County Manatee Protection Plan over the last
20 years; and

7 WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville desires to continue the 8 study of the manatees and boaters in the most cost effective manner 9 without interruption; and

10 WHEREAS, the current contract, as renewed, with Jacksonville 11 University expired on September 30, 2023, and is not eligible for 12 renewal; now therefore

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**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

14 Section 1. Authorizing the Mayor and Corporation Secretary to Execute Contract for Continuing Manatee Protection 15 Studies. Subject to appropriation by the City Council, the Mayor, 16 17 or her designee, and Corporation Secretary are authorized to execute a contract with Jacksonville University for the services of 18 Dr. Gerard Pinto for continuing manatee protection studies for 19 20 fiscal year 2023-2024, with up to four (4) annual renewals, in substantially the same form as contained in **Exhibit 1** attached 21 22 hereto and, by this reference made a part hereof. The Agreement may 23 include such additions, deletions, and changes as may be 24 reasonable, necessary, and incidental for carrying out the purpose 25 thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor or her designee, with 26 such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor or her designee. No modification of the 27 28 Agreement may increase the financial obligations or the liability 29 of City and any such modification shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval of the General 30 31 Counsel or his or her designee and all other appropriate action

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required by law.

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2 Section 2. Invoking the exemption pursuant to Section 3 126.107(g), Ordinance Code; Authorization to execute contract. Considering the expertise of Dr. Pinto, the long-standing 4 relationship between the City and Jacksonville University 5 concerning manatee research in the Lower St. Johns River, and the 6 7 continuing need for marine science support, the Council hereby invokes Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code, to exempt such services 8 9 from competitive solicitation. The City is hereby authorized to 10 directly procure the services of Jacksonville University without the necessity of competitive bidding, to perform continuing manatee 11 protection studies for fiscal year 2023-2024, with up to four (4) 12 annual renewals. With the exception of the foregoing, all other 13 provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full 14 force and effect. 15

16 Section 3. Oversight Department. The Planning and 17 Development Department shall oversee the project as described 18 herein.

19 Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 20 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 21 without the Mayor's signature.
