Michael Corbitt is a native of Jacksonville, Florida. He attended Jean Ribault High School, where he played baseball and is a graduate with class of 1979. Afterwards, he pursued his passion for logistics and started Corbitt's trucking in 1983. Corbitt's trucking created five well-paying jobs for men in the community.

Mr. Corbitt's commitment to job creation led to the launch of The Chicken Coop Café Restaurant, Chicken Koop Express and Chicken Wings and Things. The Chicken Coop Café Restaurant founded in 1995, led to the Chicken Koop Express in 1998. The Chicken Koop Express was two successful food trucks. This was a groundbreaking success for the business model well before its time. This success emerged the Chicken Koop Wings and Things in Sanford, Orlando and three Jacksonville, Florida locations. During, 20 years of business the Chicken Koop not only created 110 jobs in the community, but Michael also paid it forward by sponsorships to many parks in the community such as Scott Park, Simon Johnson, Pop Warner football teams and JTA softball team.

In 2009, He partnered with Willie Green to develop Panama Youth Services to embrace at risk male youth in the Jacksonville, Florida. A 501(c)3 non-profit organization, with a commitment to provide and encourage healthy wholesome lifestyle for its youth of service. Panama Youth Services provided outpatient substance abuse and mental health programs, early delinquency intervention, pre-employment skilled training and individual counseling based on the uniqueness of the youth. For more than ten years, with proven results hundreds of at-risk male youths benefited from the services provided.

In October 2000, he determined to change the stigma surrounding men being released from the prison system started RPN Property Management. RPN Property Management partners with the City of Jacksonville, JREC and Operation New Hope to provide housing to men recently released from prison.

Mr. Corbitt's has a substantiate reputation for extending hope, kindness, passion and the greatest of love as a philanthropist in his community on Jacksonville's northside.
