Type of Action: Appropriation of state grant funding; amendment of the 2024-2028 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan ("CIP"); designation of an oversight department

Bill Summary: This bill appropriates \$11,954 in grant funding from the Florida Department of Transportation to pay for oversight of the design of the 5th Street over Six Mile Creek Bridge No. 724039 Project. It amends the 2024-2028 Five-Year CIP to reflect this appropriation. It designates the Department of Public Works, Engineering and Construction Management Division as the oversight department for the project.

Background Information: 5th Street is a high-traffic access road in District 9, running between Ellis Road and Edgewood Avenue North. The Department of Public Works has deemed that traffic flow in the area would be severely compromised should the existing structure suffer a significant failure. The most recent Florida Department of Transportation evaluation noted that the bridge is Structurally Deficient and needs to be replaced, as the timber piles upon which the bridge deck is resting are in seriously degraded condition.

Because this Ordinance requires an amendment to the Five-Year CIP, it requires a two-thirds vote of Council members present for passage.

Policy Impact Area: Public works and bridge replacement/design

Fiscal Impact: This bill appropriates \$11,954 to pay for the design of a bridge replacement in District 9.
