Bill Summary: This bill reappoints Marsha Jackson to the Jacksonville – Duval County Council on Elder Affairs, as the Council District 10 representative, for a second full-term ending June 30, 2025. Ms. Jackson’s first term was as the representative for council district 8, but after redistricting and the establishment of the new Council District boundaries, she now resides in Council District 10.

Background Information: The Jacksonville-Duval County Council on Elder Affairs is established pursuant to Chapter 82, *Ordinance Code*, and charged to serve as an advocate for the older persons in the city, to the governmental agencies responsible for the various plans and programs designed to help older persons; assist in the implementation of plans and programs selected by regional organizations, as they relate to the city and its citizens; designate priorities among programs developed in the city by public, nonprofit and private providers concerning older persons.

Section 82.101, *Ordinance Code*, provides that the Council on Elder Affairs shall be composed of 19 members, fourteen of whom shall be appointed by the City Council (one nominee from each of the 14 District Council Members).

Ms. Jackson attended Pepperdine College and Los Angeles Community College. She retired from the Internal Revenue Service in 2017 after 32 years in various positions of customer service. Ms. Jackson resides in Duval County in council district 10.

Attendance: Ms. Jackson attended 12 of 14 meetings (86%) in her first term 5/24/22 – 6/30/23.
