Pursuant to Florida Statutes 163.3177, the CIE Schedule of Projects "includes any publicly funded projects of federal, state or local government," and may include "privately funded projects for which the local government has no fiscal responsibility." These projects are those necessary "to ensure that any adopted Level of Service Standards are achieved and maintained for" a five-year period. The projects included in the CIE contribute towards maintaining the adopted Level of Service (LOS) Standards and the Mobility System in the 2045 Comprehensive Plan. Additionally, pursuant to s. 163.3177(3)(a)(4)b, Florida Statutes, the list includes projects necessary to achieve pollutant load reductions attibutable to the local government, as established in the basin area management plan (BMAP). The Level of Service Standards address schools, potable water, sanitary sewer, solid waste, drainage, and parks and recreation while the Mobility System focuses on transportation facilities. The projects within the CIE can be funded by the local, state or federal governments or privately funded. The CIE Schedule of Projects is a planning document and is updated annually by the City's Planning and Development Department. Florida Statutes (Section 163.3177(3)) require the Capital Improvement Element Schedule of Projects to be reviewed by the local government on an annual basis. The CIE Schedule of Capital Projects includes projects from the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) (Ordinance 2023-505-E) with the City's BMAP projects identified, pursuant to s. 403.067(7), Florida Statutes, and subsequent amendments, the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) (TPO adopted June 8, 2023), the TPOs Long Range Transportation Plan, and the 2045 Mobility System Projects (Ordinance 2023-1-E, as amended by 2023-666-E). Exhibit 1 of the proposed ordinance will include the Schedule of Capital Projects for fiscal years 2024-2028.
