21 WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville applied to the Planning 22 Commission for a Zoning Exception to allow for construction of a 23 government use structure (Medical Examiner's Office) containing more than 40,000 square feet (E-23-72) on property located at 0 Baywood 24 25 Street, O Castlewood Drive West, 4430 Davis Street North, and 881 Golfair Boulevard (R.E. Nos. 031961-0000, 031962-0000, 032088-0000, 26 032092-0000 and 032093-0010), in the Public Buildings 27 and Facilities-1 (PBF-1) Zoning District; and 28

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission denied Application E-23-72 by
Final Order dated December 13, 2023; and

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WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 656.141, Ordinance Code, the City

1 of Jacksonville (Appellant) filed a notice of appeal; and

2 WHEREAS, such appeal was timely filed, and the Appellant has 3 standing to appeal; now therefore

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BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

5 Section 1. Adoption of Recommended Findings and The Council has reviewed the record of proceedings, 6 Conclusions. 7 On File in the City Council Legislative Services Division and the 8 Planning and Development Department, and has considered the 9 recommended findings and conclusions of the Land Use and Zoning 10 Committee. The recommended findings and conclusions of the Land Use and Zoning Committee are hereby adopted. Based on the competent 11 substantial evidence in the record of proceedings, including the 12 Planning and Development Department Staff Report, the evidence 13 presented during the Land Use & Zoning Committee meeting and the 14 15 record of the Jacksonville Planning Commission, the appeal is granted. The Planning Commission Final Order denying Application E-23-72 is 16 17 overturned, and Application E-23-72 is approved. Pursuant to Section 166.033, Florida Statutes, the Council hereby finds: 18

22 Based on a review and application of the standards and (2) criteria set forth in Section 656.131(c), Ordinance Code, pertaining 23 24 to Zoning Exceptions, and the competent and substantial evidence in the record of proceedings, Application for Zoning Exception E-23-72 25 26 sufficiently demonstrates a basis for granting the request to allow 27 for construction of a government use structure containing more than 28 40,000 square feet in Zoning District Public Buildings and 29 Facilities-1 (PBF-1). This Resolution is the final action of the 30 Council.
