WHEREAS, the Opioid and Substance Use Disorder ("OSUD") Grants Committee met on February 26, 2024, to approve the fiscal year 2024-2025 allocation of funding for the Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants categories; a copy of the minutes of said meeting are attached hereto as Exhibit 1; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, having considered the recommendation of the OSUD Grants Committee, hereby establishes the fiscal year 2024-2025 allocation of funding for the Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants categories; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Allocation of Funding for Opioid Settlement Section 1. Proceeds Grants Categories Established. Pursuant to Section 84.303 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Funded Categories), Part 3 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants), Chapter 84 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants), Ordinance Code, the following allocation of funding for the Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants categories, as recommended by the OSUD Grants Committee in the letter attached hereto as Exhibit 2, is hereby established for the fiscal year 2024-2025:

2024-2025 Allocation of Funding for

Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants Categories

- 1. Prevention. The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 34%.
- 2. Treatment. The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 33%.
- 3. Recovery. The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 33%.

Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants to Section 2. Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants made by City Funded Categories. Council shall be used to exclusively serve the Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants funded categories. Where a category contains more funding than applied for, the excess funding for that population may be applied to another category that contains less funding than applied for. Where more than one category has fewer funds than applied for, the excess funding shall be divided among the underfunded categories on a percentage basis where the total amount underfunded in all underfunded categories is the denominator and the amount underfunded in any one category is the numerator.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
