7 AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE FISCAL YEAR
8 2024-2025 ALLOCATION OF FUNDING FOR THE OPIOID
9 SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANTS CATEGORIES IN
10 ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 84 (OPIOID SETTLEMENT
11 PROCEEDS GRANTS), *ORDINANCE CODE*; PROVIDING AN
12 EFFECTIVE DATE.

14 **WHEREAS**, the Opioid and Substance Use Disorder ("OSUD") Grants
15 Committee met on February 26, 2024, to approve the fiscal year 2024-
16 2025 allocation of funding for the Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants
17 categories; a copy of the minutes of said meeting are attached hereto
18 as **Exhibit 1**; and

19 **WHEREAS**, the City Council, having considered the recommendation
20 of the OSUD Grants Committee, hereby establishes the fiscal year
21 2024-2025 allocation of funding for the Opioid Settlement Proceeds
22 Grants categories; now, therefore

23 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

24 **Section 1. Allocation of Funding for Opioid Settlement**
25 **Proceeds Grants Categories Established.** Pursuant to Section 84.303
26 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Funded Categories), Part 3 (Opioid
27 Settlement Proceeds Grants), Chapter 84 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds
28 Grants), *Ordinance Code*, the following allocation of funding for the
29 Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants categories, as recommended by the
30 OSUD Grants Committee in the letter attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**, is
31 hereby established for the fiscal year 2024-2025:

2024-2025 Allocation of Funding for

Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants Categories

- 1. Prevention.** The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 34%.
- 2. Treatment.** The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 33%.
- 3. Recovery.** The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 33%.

Section 2. Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants to Serve Funded Categories. Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants made by City Council shall be used to exclusively serve the Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants funded categories. Where a category contains more funding than applied for, the excess funding for that population may be applied to another category that contains less funding than applied for. Where more than one category has fewer funds than applied for, the excess funding shall be divided among the underfunded categories on a percentage basis where the total amount underfunded in all underfunded categories is the denominator and the amount underfunded in any one category is the numerator.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
