On February 26, 2024, the OSUD Grants Committee met to discuss the percentage allocations for the funded categories for the FY 2024-2025 grant cycle. The committee recommends maintaining the following percentage allocations for the upcoming grant cycle: Prevention (34%), Treatment (33%), and Recovery (33%). These percentages will be applied to the OSPG Program budget once appropriated in April 2024. The committee looks forward to evaluating the inaugural cycle's programs and utilizing that information to inform our recommendations
