AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$100,000 FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S DESIGNATED CONTINGENCY TO THE MENTAL HEALTH OFFENDER PROGRAM ("MHOP") TO PAY FOR CONTRACTUAL SERVICES BY I.M. SULZBACHER CENTER FOR THE HOMELESS, INC. ("SULZBACHER") FOR THE CONTINUED OPERATION OF A JAIL DIVERSION PROGRAM FOR MENTALLY ILL OFFENDERS THROUGH THE MHOP; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER A SIXTH AMENDMENT TO THE SERVICES CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND I.M. SULZBACHER CENTER FOR THE HOMELESS, INC. FOR THE CONTINUED PROVISION OF SERVICES FOR THE MHOP; WAIVING SECTION 118.107 (NONPROFITS TO RECEIVE FUNDING THROUGH A COMPETITIVE EVALUATED AWARD PROCESS), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR A DIRECT CONTRACT PROVIDING FOR WITH SULZBACHER; CONTRACT OVERSIGHT BY THE GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$100,000 from the Council President's Designated Contingency to the Mental Health Offender Program ("MHOP") to procure additional contractual services from I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. ("Sulzbacher") for the continued operation of a jail diversion program for mentally ill offenders through the MHOP.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide City funds to procure additional contractual services from I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. for the continued operation of a jail diversion program for mentally ill offenders through the Mental Health Offender Program.

Amendment to the Services Contract with I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, that certain Sixth Amendment to Services Contract between the City of Jacksonville and I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc., in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference, to increase the maximum indebtedness of the agreement by \$100,000 and to attach a Revised Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Budget to reflect this additional appropriation of funds, for the continued provision of services for the Mental Health Offender Program in accordance with the terms of the agreement.

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Waiver of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. The provisions of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to allow for an amendment to the Services Contract between I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc., and the City of Jacksonville. This amendment would increase the maximum indebtedness of the Services Contract by \$100,000 to provide additional funds for Sulzbacher's continued oversight and management of the jail diversion program for mentally ill offenders through the MHOP. This additional allocation of funds to the agreement with Sulzbacher is justified because Sulzbacher has successfully operated the jail diversion program since the inception of the MHOP as a nine-month pilot project.

Section 5. Oversight. The Grants and Contract Compliance Division shall oversee the contract described herein.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
