Bill Summary: This bill confirms the Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Board of Trustees' reappointment of Terry R. Wood to the Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Board of Trustees, for a second four-year term.

Background Information: The Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Board of Trustees is established pursuant to Article 22, Jacksonville Charter, as the sole entity responsible for administering the Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Fund.

Sections 175.061 and 185.05, Florida Statutes, provide that one of the members of the board shall be chosen by a majority of the other members, and as a ministerial act, appointed by Council.

Section 22.02(a), Jacksonville Charter, provides for the fifth member to a person with professional financial experience, community experience and wisdom, or comparable professional training, knowledge or expertise.

Chapter 2009-97, Laws of Florida, authorized a term of appointment of four years.

Mr. Wood holds a bachelor's degree from Florida State University and a master's degree from the University of Florida. He has worked as an insurance and government consultant since 1984. Mr. Wood served as a Jacksonville City Council Member for 5 terms, was elected council president in 1988, and was honored with the Charles D. Webb award three times. He resides in Duval County in council district 6.

Attendance: Mr. Wood attended 44 of 45 (98%) meetings in his first term 2/25/2020 - 2/25/2024.
