The existing Public Investment Policy (PIP) was originally approved by Ordinance 2016-382-E. Since that time the following amendments have been enacted: Ord. 2018-370-E: updated Façade Renovation Grant Program criteria to allow for a 2 to 1 match; Ord. 2019-243-E: updated Jacksonville Film & Television Job & Business Creation Incentive Program criteria; Ord. 2022-372-E: updated Downtown Program Incentives to reflect the updated Business Investment and Development Plan (BID Plan); and Ord. 2022-726-E: removed State programs that were eliminated; added the Local Targeted Industry Employment Grant; and modified the REV Grant criteria with regard to wage requirements for certain levels of capital investment.
 OED is requesting to amend the Public Investment Policy for the material changes noted below: Small Business Capital Access Programs have been added, including micro-grants, low-interest loans, veterans entrepreneurship, and Jacksonville Small and Emerging Business funding. Jacksonville Film & Television Programs have been expanded to include programs for qualified productions, local filmmakers, and commercial productions.
The above programs are designed to align with the Mayor's Task Force initiatives to help build local businesses, as enacted and funded via Ord. 2023-807-E. The Amendments do not affect the ROI measurement process.
