Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year,

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\$500,000.00, including \$250,000.00 in grant funding awarded by the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Office of Resilience and Coastal Protection, and \$250,000.00 from the City Resiliency Infrastructure Improvements Project for the City match, for the Huguenot Memorial Park - Shoreline Enhancement project.

Section 2. The purpose of the appropriation in 11 Purpose. Section 1 is to provide funding for the Huguenot Memorial Park -12 Shoreline Enhancement project (the "Project"). The appropriation will 13 14 be used to complete a feasibility study for the enhancement and stabilization of the southern shoreline of the park that is eroding, 15 compromising the campground and roadway. A team of consultants will 16 be hired to compile and analyze relevant data, including topographic 17 and bathymetric data, geotechnical data and aerial photographs, to 18 19 produce a final pre-design or feasibility study report that will 20 detail the scope of the problem, outline design options, and identify 21 tasks required to complete a resolution to the problem. A copy of the 22 Standard Grant Agreement Number 24SRP67 between the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection and the City of Jacksonville 23 24 setting forth the terms and conditions of the grant has been placed 25 On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 27 2023-505-E, adopting the 2024-2028 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan 28 (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is 29 hereby amended to reflect the appropriation of funds to the Project, 30 as more fully described in the Project Information Sheets attached 31 hereto as **Revised Exhibit 2**, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev CIP 1 Sheets, April 1, 2024 - NCSPHS", and incorporated herein by this 2 reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment 3 of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be 4 detrimental to the best interests of the community because such 5 deferral will unnecessarily delay the commencement and completion of 6 the Project.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2023-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2023-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

14 Section 4. Oversight. The Parks, Recreation and 15 Community Services Department shall provide oversight of the Project 16 and grant described herein.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
