6 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 122.801  
7 (DEFINITIONS), 122.811 (SALES OF TANGIBLE  
8 PERSONAL PROPERTY; PROHIBITION OF SALES TO  
9 CERTAIN PERSONS), 122.812 (SURPLUS, OBSOLETE  
10 AND WASTE SUPPLIES AND OTHER TANGIBLE PERSONAL  
11 PROPERTY), AND 122.814 (DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS  
12 TIMBER), PART 8 (TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY),  
13 CHAPTER 122 (PUBLIC PROPERTY), *ORDINANCE CODE*,  
14 TO INCREASE THE CAPITAL ASSET THRESHOLD FROM  
15 \$1,000.00 TO \$5,000.00; ESTABLISHING A  
16 PROSPECTIVE DATE OF OCTOBER 1, 2024, FOR CODE  
17 AMENDMENTS CONTAINED IN THIS ORDINANCE TO  
18 BECOME EFFECTIVE; PROVIDING CODIFICATION  
19 INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

21 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

22 **Section 1. Amending Sections 122.801 (Definitions),**  
23 **122.811 (Sales of tangible personal property; prohibition of sales**  
24 **to certain persons), 122.812 (Surplus, obsolete and waste supplies**  
25 **and other tangible personal property), and 122.814 (Disposal of**  
26 **surplus timber), Part 8 (Tangible Personal Property), Chapter 122**  
27 **(Public Property), Ordinance Code.** Sections 122.801 (Definitions),  
28 122.811 (Sales of tangible personal property; prohibition of sales  
29 to certain persons), 122.812 (Surplus, obsolete and waste supplies  
30 and other tangible personal property), and 122.814 (Disposal of  
31 surplus timber), Part 8 (Tangible Personal Property), Chapter 122

1 (Public Property), *Ordinance Code*, are hereby amended to read as  
2 follows:

3 **CHAPTER 122 - PUBLIC PROPERTY**

5 **PART 8. - TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY**

6 **Sec. 122.801. - Definitions.**

7 As used in this Part 8:

9 (e) *Property or tangible personal property* means those items of a  
10 nonconsumable nature, the value of which is \$5,000~~\$1,000~~ or  
11 more and the normal expected life of which is more than one  
12 year.

14 **Sec. 122.811. - Sales of tangible personal property; prohibition of**  
15 **sales to certain persons.**

16 (a) The procedures in Section 126.202 may be used with respect to  
17 sales of tangible personal property where the estimated sales  
18 price exceeds \$5,000~~\$1,000~~, except that awards shall be made  
19 to the highest, rather than the lowest, responsible bidder  
20 meeting or exceeding published specifications. In the  
21 alternative, the Chief of Procurement may sell the property at  
22 a public auction, be it in-person or online, to the highest  
23 responsible bidder, payable by a method accepted by the  
24 applicable auctioneer. Notice of the date, time and place of  
25 an in-person auction, as well as a general description of the  
26 items to be offered for sale, shall be published in a  
27 newspaper of general circulation in the City, or via such  
28 other advertisement or notice method as permitted by law  
29 (e.g., a publicly accessible website), and on the Procurement  
30 Division's public website, at least ten days prior to the in-  
31 person auction date. Online auctions shall take place at a

1 time and duration as determined by the Chief of Procurement  
2 without such notification requirement, provided that a  
3 description of the online auction process and a link to the  
4 online auctioneer's website is published on the Procurement  
5 Division's public website.

7 **Sec. 122.812. - Surplus, obsolete and waste supplies and other**  
8 **tangible personal property.**

10 (f) The JEA is authorized, with the prior approval of the Chief of  
11 Procurement, to negotiate the sale of tangible personal  
12 property valued in excess of \$5,000~~\$1,000~~ under one of the  
13 following conditions:

- 14 (1) Competitive bidding has resulted in no responsive bids or  
15 a high responsive bid less than 75 percent of the fair  
16 market value of the property.
- 17 (2) The JEA has determined by resolution that the nature of  
18 the market is not conducive to competitive sale.

20 **Sec. 122.814. - Disposal of surplus timber.**

21 The disposal of cut or uncut timber, after being declared  
22 surplus by the using agency and the permit required by Chapter 304  
23 having been obtained, may be made by the Chief of Procurement  
24 according to the following:

- 25 (a) If the estimated value is \$5,000~~\$1,000~~ or more, to the  
26 highest bidder meeting or exceeding specifications after  
27 publication in a local newspaper of general circulation or  
28 via such other advertisement or notice method as permitted  
29 by law (e.g., a publicly accessible website).
- 30 (b) If there are no acceptable bids received pursuant to  
31 subsection (a) or if the estimated value is less than
