Proposed ordinance's title/reference:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 108.102 (SCOPE OF CENTRAL SERVICES; LIMITATIONS), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 108 (CENTRAL SERVICES), ORDINANCE CODE, TO CLARIFY THE UTILIZATION OF CENTRAL SERVICES OF THE CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT AS REQUIRED UNDER SECTION 24.04 OF THE CHARTER; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

1. Summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals, and welfare):

Ordinance 2024-175-E reorganized the Executive Branch. As part of that reorganization the Department of Finance and Administration became the Department of Finance with certain Divisions within the Department of Finance and Administration being divided into separate departments within the Executive Branch. More specifically, the Procurement Division and the Fleet Management
