

## **BUSINESS IMPACT ESTIMATE**

## **ORDINANCE 2025-138**

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING UNAUTHORIZED ALIENS IN DUVAL COUNTY; REQUIRING A REPORT BY THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, PERTAINING TO: (1) FEDERAL GRANTS, (2) DIVERSITY, EQUITY AND INCLUSION PRACTICES AND POLICIES, AND (3) HOUSING OF UNAUTHORIZED ALIENS; AMENDING SECTION 77.111 (CONTRACTS; CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION; CARRYOVER), CHAPTER 77 (KIDS HOPE ALLIANCE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO REQUIRE A PROVISION PROHIBITING THE USE OF CITY FUNDS FOR THE PROVISION OF SERVICES TO UNAUTHORIZED ALIENS TO BE INCLUDED IN ALL PROVIDER, SMALL PROVIDER, INTER-AGENCY AND RELATED CONTRACTS; AMENDING SECTION 118.201 (RELEASE OF APPROPRIATIONS), PART 2 (DISBURSEMENT OF CITY GRANTS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO PROVIDE THAT ANY APPROPRIATIONS MADE PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 118 SHALL BE RELEASED AND DISBURSED WITH A CONDITION THAT ANY RECIPIENT SHALL BE PROHIBITED FROM USING SUCH FUNDS FOR THE PROVISION OF SERVICES TO UNAUTHORIZED ALIENS; AMENDING SECTION 118.609 (RESTRICTIONS FOR USE OF CULTURAL SERVICE GRANTS), SUBPART A (CULTURAL SERVICE GRANT PROGRAM), PART 6 (CULTURAL SERVICE GRANTS AND ART IN PUBLIC PLACES), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO PROHIBIT USE OF CULTURAL SERVICE GRANT FUNDS FOR THE PROVISION OF SERVICES TO UNAUTHORIZED ALIENS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

1. Summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals, and welfare): This legislation requires the Mayor, or her designee, to provide a report to the City Council pertaining to: (1) federal grants, (2) Diversity, Equity and Inclusion policies and practices, and (3) housing of unauthorized aliens in housing under the City's control. The legislation also amends the Code to provide that various grant dollars disbursed by the City of Jacksonville cannot be used by any recipient to provide services or support to unauthorized aliens as that term is defined in Florida Statutes. This serves the public welfare by identifying where changing federal and/or state law and policies may affect City practices and policies and the scope of that impact so that appropriate compliance measures can be implemented, if necessary. It also serves to ensure that the distribution of City funds is limited to assisting individuals and families who are in the United States legally.

2. An estimate of the direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, for-profit businesses in the City of Jacksonville, if any:

- (a) An estimate of direct compliance costs that businesses may reasonably incur;
- (b) Any new charge or fee imposed by the proposed ordinance or for which businesses will be financially responsible; and
- (c) An estimate of the City of Jacksonville's regulatory costs, including estimated revenues from any new charges or fees to cover such costs. N/A

3. Good faith estimate of the number of businesses likely to be impacted by the proposed ordinance: The number of businesses likely to be impacted is minimal. The entities that would be impacted are those that have received grant funding in the past for programs that provide support or services to unauthorized aliens as they would no longer qualify to receive City grant funds for those programs. However, nothing would preclude these entities from pursuing grant dollars from the City for programs that provide services and support to individuals who are not unauthorized aliens.
