AN ORDINANCE CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF DR. HUSON GILBERSTADT, AS A MEMBER OF THE OPIOID ABUSE PREVENTION COMMITTEE, AS A MEDICAL **EMERGENCY** DEPARTMENT PROFESSIONAL, REPRESENTATIVE, PURSUANT TO SECTION 84.202, ORDINANCE CODE, FOR AN INITIAL TERM ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2022; ESTABLISHING SUBSTANTIAL BUSINESS INTEREST IN DUVAL COUNTY, PURSUANT TO SECTION 50.102(B) (RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT), ORDINANCE CODE; PROVIDING FOR WAIVER OF SECTION 50.102(C) (MEMBERS OF BOARDS AND THE COMMISSIONS), ORDINANCE CODE, AS BILL SPONSOR APPEAR THE REQUIREMENT THAT A SEPARATE BEFORE THE RULES COMMITTEE AT MEETING AND PRIOR TO THE APPEARANCE OF THE THE · DEBATE APPOINTEE, TO ESTABLISH AND THE SUBSTANTIAL BUSINESS REQUIREMENTS OF CONTRIBUTION OF THE APPOINTEE; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2019-56-E enacted March 26, 2019, created the Opioid Abuse Prevention Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor shall appoint nine members of the Opioid Abuse Prevention Committee within various categories as provided by Section 84.202, Ordinance Code; and

WHEREAS, on May 28, 2019, Resolution 2019-412 was introduced

to have Dr. Gilberstadt appointed to the Opioid Abuse Prevention Committee, but listed Dr. Gilberstadt as a Duval County resident;

WHEREAS, on June 18, 2019, the Rules Committee interviewed Dr. Gilberstadt and approved his appointment resolution 2019-412 unanimously, and placed the Resolution on the Council agenda to be considered at the June 25, 2019 regular Council meeting; and

WHEREAS, in order to correct Dr. Gilberstadt's county of residence and to establish substantial economic business interest in Duval County, Resolution 2019-412 is being withdrawn and this legislation is being filed to avoid confusing and delay of the appointment; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appointment. The Council hereby confirms the Mayor's appointment of Dr. Huson Gilberstadt, a Nassau County resident with substantial economic business interests in Duval County, to the Opioid Abuse Prevention Committee, as a Medical Professional, Emergency Department representative, in accordance with Section 84.202, Ordinance Code, for an initial term expiring September 30, 2022.

Non-Resident Duval County with Section 2. Α οf substantial economic business interests in Duval County. Section (Members of boards and commissions), Ordinance Code, 50.102 requires Board and Commission members be either a Duval County substantial economic business individuals with orinterests in Duval County. Dr. Gilberstadt has substantial business interests in Duval County. Dr. Gilberstadt was born and raised in Jacksonville. Since 2016, Dr. Gilberstadt has been serving as the Ascension Florida Clinical Officer for the Chief Previously, Dr. Gilberstadt served in the dual role as Chief Clinical Officer for St. Vincent's Healthcare and President of St.

Vincent's Riverside. Dr. Gilberstadt has also served as Chief Medical Officer of St. Vincent's Riverside Acute Care Division. Dr. Gilberstadt has also been a physician advisor at the three St. Vincent locates and worked for the Emergency Medical Specialists of Jacksonville.

50.102 Section 3. Waiver of Section (c) (Members boards and commissions), Ordinance Code. Section 50.102 (Members of boards and commissions), 50 (Organization of Boards and Commissions), Ordinance Code, is hereby waived to the requirement that the bill sponsor appear before the Rules Committee at a meeting separate and prior to the appearance of the appointee, to establish and debate the requirements of the substantial business contribution of the appointee. A waiver is required because the appointee appeared prior to the discussion of the substantial business interest and that the substantial business interest is being established herein.

Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction Section 4. pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. Emergency passage of this legislation is requested upon introduction. The nature of the emergency is that the Opioid Abuse Prevention Committee would like to start meeting as soon as possible, and Dr. Gilberstadt has interviewed the Rules Committee, been by appointment will add to the Committee to avoid potential loss of quorum.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
