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ORDINANCE 2019-520

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; APPROPRIATING \$395,915.00 (\$296,936.25 FROM THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) THROUGH THE FLORIDA DIVISION OF **EMERGENCY** MANAGEMENT (FDEM) AND A 25% CITY MATCH OF \$98,978.75 FROM THE RESERVE FOR FEDERAL FUNDS) UNDER THE HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM TO ACQUIRE AND DEMOLISH A FLOOD-PRONE PROPERTY AND RETURN IT TO GREEN SPACE, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 19-101; AMENDING THE 2019-2023 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2018-505-E TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PROJECT ENTITLED "ACQUISITION AND DEMOLITION OF FLOODPRONE PROPERTY;" AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE FEDERALLY-FUNDED SUBAWARD AND GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN FDEM AND CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT ΒY **EMERGENCY** PREPAREDNESS DIVISION OF THE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2018-2019 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is an award in the amount of \$296,936.25 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) through the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management (75%) and a City match of \$98,978.75 from the Reserve for Federal Funds (25%) for a Hazard Mitigation Grant project.

The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2. Purpose. Section 1 is to provide funding for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program project (the "Project") to acquire and demolish a structure located adjacent to Pottsburg Creek at 8369 Bascom Jacksonville, Florida 32216 (the "Subject Property"). Heavy rains and storm surge events related to Hurricane Matthew and Hurricane Irma caused tremendous damage, expense, time loss, and disruption to the residents of this home. Damages were estimated to \$55,000.00 for Hurricane Matthew and \$77,000.00 for Hurricane Irma. The Project will remove the structure from the threat of future flood damages. Acquisition and demolition is the most effective means to protect against flooding and has been promoted as the preferred method of reducing flood risks. The completion of Project will reduce future public costs to county, state, federal agencies that provide, among other things, evacuation and rescue, emergency shelter, and debris removal services. The Project will also remove the current residents from the immediate dangers

of flooding. The Subject Property will be returned to green space, thus improving local flood storage and conveyance. Finally, the Subject Property will be deed-restricted so as not to allow a new structure that inevitably would be damaged by future flooding to be built.

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Section 3. CIP Amendment. Ordinance 2018-505-E, being the 2019-2023 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide funding for the project entitled "Acquisition and Demolition of a Floodprone Property." The Project is more fully described in the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 incorporated herein by this reference. The Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will delay urgently needed mitigation. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this ordinance requires the affirmative vote of twothirds of the Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2018-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program approved by Ordinance 2018-505-E shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. Authorization to execute. The Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement between the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management and the City of Jacksonville, in substantially the same form placed on file with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 5. Oversight. The Emergency Preparedness Division of the Fire and Rescue Department will provide oversight.
