RE: West 1st Street to Reverend Henry T. Rhim Blvd

DATE: March 27, 2019

Consistent with Chapter 745 of the Jacksonville Ordinance Code on addressing and street naming regulations, requests to rename streets require a review and recommendation from the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission. In making a report and recommendation, the Commission shall address the following criteria:

- 1. The origin of the street name
- 2. Any historical significance of the existing street name
- 3. Whether there are any historical structures or landmarks on the subject street
- 4. Whether the existing name is part of a common theme of street names throughout the community where such street is located
- 5. The age of the street name
- 6. Whether the street name is a duplicate street name

Present Street Name: West 1st Street

Proposed Street Name: Reverend Henry T. Rhim Blvd

Reason for Change:

The proposed street name change is for the purpose of recognizing Reverend Henry T. Rhim for his accomplishments and contributions to Jacksonville's history and culture.

Background:

This portion of West 1st Street is located northwest of Downtown Jacksonville near the western edge of Springfield. Originally platted as Eagle Street, as part of the Edward A. Decotte's Subdivision in 1888. Eagle Street did not occupy the current location of this portion of 1st Street and appeared to be predominately a foot path, with a "foot bridge" noted at the crossing of Hogan's Creek. The Hogan's Creek Unit One replat established this portion of 1st street in 1979.

Report and Recommendation:

The origin of the street name and any historical significance of the existing street name Located to the northwest of Downtown Jacksonville, the area was orgiogonally platted in the late 1800s. Though this area was historially platted in 1888, the orgional orientation and name of Eagle Street has changed completely to what it is today, as a protion of the

historic West 1st Street. Although West 1st Street is part of the historic grid of the City, this portion was never historically named West 1st Street, or in the current location or configuration.

Whether there are any historical structures or landmarks on the subject street
This portion of West 1st Street is populated by modern development. Any Historic structures that may have been located along Eagle Street are either no longer there, or are not located along this portion of West 1st Street because of the replat / realignment.

Whether the existing name is part of a common theme of street names throughout the community where such street is located

As noted above, the name of West 1st Street is part of the historic platted grid of Springfield. As this portion resides west of Hogan's Creek, it was never part of the historic street grid, and dead ends at Jefferson Street.

The age of the street name

Although the name West 1st Street is part of the 1901 Plat for West Springfield, the name was not extended to this road segment until 1979, as best as staff can determine.

Whether the street name is a duplicate street name

The street name is not a duplicate.

Recommendation:

The Planning and Development Department recommends that the proposed street name change from West 1st Street to Reverend Henry T. Rhim Blvd be approved by the Commission.

10 Just to kind of go over the basics, this is an odd little pocket of unplatted land that 11 has been replatted over the years and 12 13 originally didn't have a clean grid street system to connect to the existing street system 14 other than a foot path at one point. 15

17 recommendation is the origin of the street name, the historical significance of the 18 existing street name, whether there are any 19 20 historical structures or landmarks that are on 21 the subject street, whether the existing name 22 is part of a common theme of streets throughout the community, the age of the street, and 24 whether the street is duplicated anywhere in 25 the city.

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So just running through those criteria briefly, as I said, the background on this is 2

3 that this was originally a plat that was

different than the Springfield plat and other 4

denoted plats in the downtown area. It was part of the Edward Decotte plat from 1888. 6

Again, this is the area that's under consideration (indicating). So it goes from

Pearl Street here, this is West 1st as it 9

follows the Springfield plat, and then kind of 10 11 curves around Missionary Baptist Church and

then connects to Jefferson here. 12

13 Originally, this area was part of this older plat, and this area was known as Eagle 14 Street. And as you can see, this would be the edge of 1st Street here -- or actually, I think 17 it's up here, but it doesn't match up to the 18 standard square block grid of the current district. 19

And just for reference, again, this is the area we're talking about (indicating). Here's Hogan's Creek. And here is another look at Hogan's Creek, Hogan Street, and this is Eagle here.

And we will move right along to New Business. Do I have a staff report on this road renaming?

MR. POPOLI: Through the Chair, yes. We have a staff report.

This is a request for a road renaming. Chapter 745 of the Municipal Code requires that this commission, as well as the 911 Addressing Committee, review requests for road renamings and provide a recommendation to City Council.

21 22 The request is for a portion of West 4th Street, basically between North Pearl Street

23 and Broad Street -- no, that's not correct.

25 Sorry. It goes beyond that. Well, whatever

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Again, you can see Eagle Street and how it's kind of at an angle to the grid system. 2

3 This is a key map from an early Sanborn 4 that shows, again, where 1st Street ends, Hogan's Creek, and then Eagle would begin on an 5 earlier map, which I wasn't able to get a clear 7 picture of. This is actually noted as a footbridge, so it wasn't even a continuous 9 street.

And here, again, you can see where 1st Street and Eagle -- this name had been 11 12 changed -- or is referenced differently at different times as 1st Street or Eagle Street, 13 14 but was never formally changed and it was never 15 replatted. And then in 1979 this area was 16 replatted and West 1st Street was created in this portion to connect to the original grid. 17

So that's a little background. So that is 19 the origin of the name and its reflection on the current naming system. 20

Although there were historic structures 22 built along Eagle Street, none of them 23 currently remain, so there are no historical 24 structures or landmarks along the street. As I 25 noted earlier, there are portions of West 1st

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Street, obviously, that are historic and exist,

2 but this particular portion did not. And

1st Street, as it's known now, dead ends at

Jefferson, so there's no continuation of this 4

beyond, except outside the Urban Core. 5

6 As I mentioned, West 1st Street goes back 7 to 1901 as part of the Springfield plat, but this segment wasn't created until 1979. And then beyond this, West 1st Street is not 9 duplicated within the core. 10

So based on that and its lack of 12 historical context for this particular segment, we're actually recommending approval from West 1st Street to Reverend Henry T. Rhim Boulevard, to pass that recommendation on to 16 the City Council.

THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Does anybody have any questions for staff?

19 COMMISSIONER KASPER: Yes. Are we referring to only the strip of West 1st Street 20 from Jefferson to Pearl? 21

MR. POPOLI: Yes, that's correct.

COMMISSIONER BRAMWELL: Do we know 23 24 anything about who Reverend Henry Rhim is or 25 was?

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1 MR. POPOLI: Yes. At the end of your packet is the actual ordinance that goes into 2 fairly great detail on his life and 3 4 accomplishments.

I will note that one of the things they're 5 calling for in the ordinance is the waiver of 6 7 the provision, 745.105(I)(2), which -- I think that's correct. A portion of 745.105, which 8 9 requires that the person who the road is being 10 named after must be deceased five years. Although it's not clear, I'm speculating that 11 12 he is still alive.

13 But according to the ordinance, he's been 14 a major contributor to the local congregation, the community at large, and he's been involved 15 in many good works in the city. The particular 16 church has been in the city a very long time. 17 He's received many accolades from other -- both 18 religious and educational institutions, various 19 20 contributions to the local and state government. So I think a worthy individual as 21 22 outlined in the ordinance.

COMMISSIONER BRAMWELL: I was more 23 24 concerned about the alive or dead thing because 25 that's a pretty standard policy.

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1 MR. POPOLI: It's actually enumerated in the code, but the sponsor and councilman has 2

3 asked to waive that provision. So I don't

know, like I said, if he's currently alive or 4

if he's recently passed away, but he's

apparently not been dead five years. 6

COMMISSIONER KASPER: Through the Chair to

20 COMMISSIONER KASPER: So any traffic or safety concerns is not our concern? 21

MR. POPOLI: Correct.
