RESOLUTION 2019-479-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING THE CAREER AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF TOM GOLDSBURY ON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Tom Goldsbury earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in civil engineering at Penn State University and began his career as a construction manager/field engineer for the Dravo Corporation, working on materials handling projects around the United States and in South Africa; and

WHEREAS, the first 20 years of his career was spent in the private sector working for some of the best known engineering companies in the country on a wide variety of construction and maintenance projects, increasingly focused in Florida; and

WHEREAS, in 1992 Mr. Goldsbury was hired by the City of Jacksonville as a project manager and then an engineer manager in the Public Works Department, working on projects including the Northbank Riverwalk, New Blodgett Homes, and many of the Better Jacksonville Plan building projects in his two stints as engineer manager. He was integrally involved in the projects to renovate the St. James Building into City Hall, in the substantial renovation of and additions to the Times-Union Center for the Performing Arts, the Ed Ball Building, EverBank Field and the conversion of the old Federal Courthouse into the new State Attorney's Office; and

WHEREAS, from January of 1998 through October 2011 and again from February of 2014 to the present, Tom Goldsbury has served as Chief of the City's Building Inspection Division, managing the

employees on the front line of development permitting in Jacksonville, ensuring the proper interpretation and enforcement of the City's building and development codes, and lending his long experience and deep expertise to special projects such as reconstruction of the Jacksonville Beach pier and the permit fee rebate for property owners forced to make roofing and electrical repairs to address damages caused by Hurricane Irma; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Goldsbury has been instrumental in fostering positive changes in the Building Inspection Division in collaboration with his employees, encouraging a focus on customer service, instituting building inspection and permitting processes that are considered best practice in the State of Florida, and spearheading the creation of an building inspection/permitting database that was created in house by the City's Information Technology Division; and

WHEREAS, Tom Goldsbury, a golfer, woodworker and avid Jaguars fan, also gives back to the community as a board member of Builders Care and of the ACE Mentor Program, has been a board member and Treasurer of the North Florida Chapter of the U.S. Green Building Council, and is a Past President and currently 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President of the First Coast Chapter of the Building Officials Association of Florida; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and commends the long career and numerous accomplishments of Tom Goldsbury on the occasion of his retirement after 27 years with the City, and extends its best wishes for health and happiness in the years to come. Mr. Goldsbury's professionalism, dedication to public service, and wise counsel are gratefully acknowledged and will be long remembered.
