A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING THE LIFE AND MANY ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF MIKE HIGHTOWER UPON THE OCCASION OF HIS LATEST RETIREMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Mike Hightower, a native of Jacksonville's Westside, graduated from Forrest High School and Jacksonville University and began his working life as a shift supervisor for the Hudson Pulp Paper Corporation in Palatka, then served four years in the U.S. Air Force before becoming a junior high school civics teacher and then an accountability design specialist with the Duval County Public Schools; and

WHEREAS, following a chance meeting with then-presidential candidate Jimmy Carter in 1976, Mr. Hightower managed the Carter/Mondale campaign in Jacksonville which introduced him to the world of campaigns and elections. He was appointed by President Carter as the Florida State Director of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farmers Home Administration, then joined Blue Cross Blue Shield of Florida in 1981 as Director of Governmental and Legislative Relations and eventually as a corporate Vice President; and

WHEREAS, his retirement from Florida Blue in 2014 was short-lived - after four months he joined the Holland & Knight law firm as a senior policy advisor, then in 2015 was appointed Chief Public and Stakeholder Affairs Officer for the JEA, an organization that he knew intimately from having previously served several terms on the JEA Board of Directors, including as Chairman in 2002-2004. In

that position he has led JEA's team handling local, state and federal legislative and regulatory policy issues; and

WHEREAS, throughout his long and varied career, Mike Hightower has been particularly known for two things — his expertise in political campaign management and fundraising, and his dedication to community service in a wide variety of capacities. Mr. Hightower has been integrally involved in well over 400 campaigns serving in key management and fundraising capacities and is conservatively estimated to have raised over \$100 million for political candidates, political parties, and charitable institutions and causes over the course of five decades. He has also helped establish and continues to run an Emerging Leaders Program to introduce up-and-coming talent in Jacksonville to the importance of enlightened political leadership by informing them about the characteristics and needs of the community and teaching the nuts and bolts of the political process; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hightower has lent his expertise and commitment to the betterment of his community to countless civic charitable causes over the years. He has served on and chaired boards of directors of organizations that range Jacksonville Public Library Foundation to the Jacksonville Chamber of Commerce, and from the Jacksonville Sister Cities Association and Florida Chamber of Commerce to the Board of Visitors of the U.S. Naval Academy and the Ritz Theater and LaVilla Museum Board. He is the recipient of dozens of awards and commendations, including the Florence N. Davis Community Lifetime Achievement Award, the John L. Ricciardelli Lifetime Leadership Achievement Award of the Florida Insurance Council, the Soaring Distinguished Service Award from the Children's Resource Fund, and the Jacksonville University Distinguished Alumnus Award, among many, many others; and

WHEREAS, Mike Hightower has recently announced his latest retirement to devote more time to his family, especially his cherished granddaughter Gracie; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and Section 1. commends the life and countless accomplishments of Mike Hightower as he retires from the position of Chief Public and Stakeholder Affairs Officer for the JEA, and extends its heartfelt thanks for his many contributions to the Jacksonville community over the decades. His example of civic stewardship and service gratefully acknowledged and will be long remembered by those whose lives he positively impacted.
