- This position was responsible for coordinating HIV/AIDS prevention activities in the 5 counties of N. E. Florida and the managing of prevention contracts: Targeted Outreach to Pregnant Women (TOPWA), IDU and HIV/AIDS Outreach and prevention; coordinate the development of the local prevention plan and participate in the writing of the statewide HIV/AIDS Prevention Plan; Co-Chair the local prevention planning body and participate in the State Planning Group as an active member of several committees; participate as a member of the Ryan White Title I Council, State Literature Review Panel (Chair) and numerous other prevention groups in our area; participated in community development and needs assessments; developed and hosted a weekly television show (Health Trends). This position was also responsible for the Medicaid and Ryan White mental health programs of the Duval County Health department.
- Responsible for planning, evaluating and managing programs which provided prevention and intervention services to individuals, families at risk of HIV infection and other health-related problems; worked closely with the communities of faith.
- Responsible for the counseling of youths and their families in relationship to Disease control and prevention
- Developed and coordinated the Youth Explosion for 300 youth in HIV Education Risk Reduction and Substance Abuse with the churches and Minority AIDS Coalition. This was a 24 hour prevention model of intensive intervention being used for youth in our area.
- Encouraged Baptist ministers in Jacksonville and statewide to adopt HIV/AIDS issues as a needed ministry. It was added to the educational curriculum in 1996; developed a Faith-based Advisory group to provide feedback to the AIDES Program Office for the development of appropriate services to the churches; continued to advocate for culturally specific training modules for HIV education in the African-American community.; structured work groups to address HIV/AIDS issues in the communities of greatest prevalence.
