A RESOLUTION REQUESTING AN ATTORNEY GENERAL THEJACKSONVILLE CITY COUNCIL'S OPINION ON PERMISSIBLE ACTIONS ON THE DUVAL COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD'S REQUEST FOR A SCHOOL CAPITAL OUTLAY SURTAX REFERENDUM, PURSUANT TO 212.055(6), FLORIDA STATUTES; PROVIDING FOR A GENERAL COUNSEL OPINION; DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES TO FORWARD A COPY OF THE RESOLUTION TO \mathtt{THE} FLORIDA ATTORNEY GENERAL; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Council acts as a collegial body, and therefore an inquiry of the City Council of the City of Jacksonville is required to obtain an opinion from the Attorney General; and

WHEREAS, this is a matter concerning Florida State Statute 212.055(6), School Capital Outlay Surtax; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Request for an Opinion from the Attorney General. The City of Jacksonville hereby requests an opinion from the Florida Attorney General specific to the following inquiry:

- Whether the School Board may call a special I. election.
- II. Whether the School Board may call a referendum election.

- III. Whether the City Council has the discretion to select the date of the referendum election.
 - IV. Whether the City Council has the discretion to reject a School Board request to call a special election to place a School Capital Surtax on the ballot.
 - V. Whether the City Council has the discretion to refuse to place a School Capital Surtax on any ballot.
- VI. Whether a court has the power to order the Council to call a special election to hold a referendum on a School Capital Surtax.
- VII. Whether a court has the power to order the Council to place a School Capital Surtax on any ballot.
- Section 2. General Counsel Opinion. The General Counsel has reviewed and answered the above questions. A memorandum from the General Counsel, substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit 1, shall be attached to the request submitted to the Attorney General.
- Section 3. Direction to forward the resolution to the Florida Attorney General. The City Council Legislative Services Division is hereby directed to forward this request in the form of the enacted resolution to Ashley Moody, Florida Attorney General.
- Section 4. Requesting emergency passage upon introduction pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that legislation, Ordinance 2019-380, requesting action on the Duval County School Board Resolution requesting a referendum is pending before Council.
- Section 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

without the Mayor's signature.
