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5 AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION SERVICES; DECLARING THAT PUBLIC 6 7 CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY REQUIRE THE ISSUANCE 8 OF А CERTIFICATE FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL 9 TRANSPORTATION SERVICE PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 158, ORDINANCE CODE, ТО 10 MAYO CLINIC JACKSONVILLE; AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF THE 11 FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT, OR DESIGNEE, TO 12 ISSUE SAID CERTIFICATE; APPROVING THE FIRST 13 ТО AMENDMENT MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING 14 15 BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND MAYO CLINIC JACKSONVILLE, F/K/A MAYO 16 CLINIC REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY 17 FLORIDA; PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 18

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

21 Section 1. Background. Chapter 158, Ordinance Code, 22 requires that a person or entity engaging in prehospital emergency 23 medical transportation service first secure a Certificate of Public 24 Convenience and Necessity (COPCN). Pursuant to Section 158.204, 25 Mayo Clinic Florida submitted an application to the Director of the 26 Fire and Rescue Department (the "Director") to operate, conduct, or 27 otherwise engage in prehospital emergency medical transportation 28 service. Pursuant to Section 158.205, Ordinance Code, the 29 application was reviewed and verified by the Director and forwarded to the Council Secretary. The Council Secretary submitted the 30 application to the Public Health and Safety Committee, which voted 31

to recommend Mayo Clinic Florida's application for the COPCN to 1 2 Council. In Ordinance 2018-411-E, enacted August 14, 2018, the Council authorized the Director to issue the COPCN to Mayo Clinic 3 Florida. Mayo Clinic Florida is changing the name of the entity 4 that will operate the service to Mayo Clinic Jacksonville, to be 5 operated under the name of Mayo Clinic Jacksonville Medical 6 7 Transport, and Mayo Clinic Jacksonville has filed an application for a COPCN to be issued in the name of Mayo Clinic Jacksonville. 8 9 Mayo Clinic Jacksonville is the parent entity of Mayo Clinic 10 Florida, and Mayo Clinic Jacksonville's application for the COPCN is identical to Mayo Clinic Florida's application except as to the 11 12 name of the applicant.

Section 2. Issuance of Certificate. The Council finds that the public convenience and necessity require the issuance of a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for emergency medical transportation service to Mayo Clinic Jacksonville to operate the vehicle(s) listed in its application for emergency medical transportation service.

19 Section 3. Authorization. The Director of the Fire and 20 Rescue Department, or his designee, is hereby authorized to grant 21 to Mayo Clinic Jacksonville the certificate described in Section 1 22 hereof in accordance with Chapter 158, Ordinance Code.

23 Section 4. Approving amendment to MOU. As a condition 24 of the issuance of the COPCN to Mayo Clinic Florida, the company 25 signed an MOU agreeing to relocate additional resources from the 26 company's other operating areas to Jacksonville in the event of a 27 declared emergency and to partner with JFRD to meet the imminent 2.8 needs of the citizens of Jacksonville, including but not limited to 29 hospital and nursing home evacuations, and response to 911 30 emergencies in collaboration with JFRD. There is hereby approved, 31 and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are

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hereby authorized to execute and deliver the First Amendment to Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Jacksonville and Mayo Clinic Jacksonville, operating as Mayo Clinic Jacksonville Medical Transport, a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1**, to change the name of Mayo Clinic Florida to Mayo Clinic Jacksonville.

7 Section 5. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency 8 9 passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the 10 emergency is that Mayo Hospital emergency transport is being delayed pending this COPCN. These transports would assist JFRD 11 during hurricanes, and Florida is presently in the hurricane 12 13 season.

Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
