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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2018-2019 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of appropriation

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2 The funding above is a transfer of funds from the 3 Environmental Compliance - Countywide Account to the Confederate Park - MGP Waste Remediation Account to fund 4 5 activities involved in the cleanup of manufactured gas 6 the Brownfield Site plant waste required by 7 Rehabilitation Agreement between and among the Florida 8 Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP), the City 9 of Jacksonville, Southport Financial Real Estate, LLC, 10 Jacksonville Hospitality Holdings, L.P., and Shoppes of 11 Lakeside, Inc. (BSRA).

12 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 13 Section 1 is to provide funding for remediation and cleanup of 14 manufactured gas plant waste located under Hogan's Creek, 15 Confederate Park, Orange Avenue, the former E. Η. Thompson 16 Building, and Ocean Avenue, required by the BSRA approved by 17 Ordinance 2018-542-E. Funding will be needed until project 18 completion. However, since the remedial action has not been 19 prepared for FDEP review and approval, the project's completion and 20 maintenance costs cannot be determined at this time.

21 Section 3. CIP Amendment. Ordinance 2018-505-E, being the 22 2019-2023 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and 23 certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to reduce 24 funding for the project entitled "Environmental Compliance 25 Countywide" and provide funding for the project entitled "MGP Waste 26 Remediation." The project is more fully described in the Project 27 Information Sheet, attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated 28 herein by this reference. The Council finds that the deferral of 29 this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP 30 review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community 31 because such deferral will not be in accordance with the time

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1 frames for delivery of required work items listed in the BSRA. 2 Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this 3 ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the 4 Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment 5 set forth in this section. This ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2018-505-E. In all other respects, the 6 7 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program approved by Ordinance 2018-8 505-E shall continue in full force and effect.

9 Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become 10 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 11 without the Mayor's signature.
