## ORDINANCE 2019-523-E

ΑN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$400,000.00 INSURPLUS FUNDS FROM THE GENERAL FUND - ECONOMIC GRANT PROGRAM TO MENTAL HEALTHRESOURCE CENTER, INC. TO PARTIALLY FUND AN OUTPATIENT COMPREHENSIVE SERVICES CENTER AT MENTAL HEALTH INC.'S RESOURCE CENTER, ("MHRC") SOUTH FACILITY, AS INITIATED BY REVISED B.T. 19-105; PROVIDING FOR A CARRYOVER OF FUNDS TO FISCAL YEAR 2019-2020; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE ("CITY"), THE FUNDING AGREEMENT MHRC TO PARTIALLY FUND THECENTER; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE OFFICE GRANTS AND COMPLIANCE; PROVIDING ANEFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2018-2019 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the accounts(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is a transfer of surplus funds from the General Fund - Economic Grant Program to Mental Health Resource Center, Inc. to partially fund an outpatient Comprehensive Services Center at Mental Health Resource Center's South facility located at 11820 Beach Boulevard ("South CRC") so that it may continue providing important mental health services to the Duval County community.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide partial funding for MHRC's South CRC facility. MHRC currently operates a Comprehensive Services Center at its North Baker Act receiving facility located at 3333 West 20th Street ("North CRC"), at which MHRC has provided the following levels of service during the twelve months beginning June 1, 2018 and ending May 31, 2019: 2,845 instances of service on a walk-in basis, 14,870 outpatient appointments, including 1,540 psychiatric evaluations, 2,378 counselling sessions, and 10,952 office visits for medication management, and 1,906 instances of community resource assistance. MHRC's South CRC facility is projected to provide to the residents of south Jacksonville and the beaches the types and levels of service comparable to those of the North CRC. MHRC is a non-profit mental health services provider in Duval County that is currently experiencing financial difficulties which threaten its continued operations. The additional support necessary to help MHRC through this difficult period so that it may continue to provide important mental health services to the Duval

County community. MHRC treats approximately 39% of the Baker Act cases in Duval County and is also a primary intake for JSO. In 2018, MHRC treated 7,692 admitted cases and employed 380 Jacksonville-area residents. It is also a significant partner in the Urban Rest Stop, which treats the underlying causes of homelessness.

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated in Section

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated in Section 1 of this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover into fiscal year 2019-2020.

Section 4. Approval and Authorization. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor or his designee and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, a funding agreement ("Agreement") in substantially the same form as is attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. The Agreement provides for \$400,000 to partially fund an outpatient comprehensive services center at MHRC's South CRC facility.

Section 5. Oversight. The Office of Grants and Compliance shall oversee the project described herein.

Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
