AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; APPROPRIATING \$496,965.00 (\$372,723.75 FROM THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) THROUGH THE FLORIDA DIVISION OF **EMERGENCY** MANAGEMENT (FDEM) AND A 25% CITY MATCH OF \$124,241.25 FROM GENERAL FUND GSD) UNDER THE HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM TO ACQUIRE AND DEMOLISH A FLOOD-PRONE PROPERTY AND RETURN IT TO GREEN SPACE, AS INITIATED BY REVISED B.T. 19-100; AMENDING THE 2019-2023 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM APPROVED ORDINANCE 2018-505-E TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PROJECT ENTITLED "ACQUISITION & DEMO OF FLOODPRONE PROPERTY OAKWOOD DRIVE"; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE FEDERALLY-FUNDED SUBAWARD AND GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN FDEM AND CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY **EMERGENCY** PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; REQUIRING OUARTERLY REPORTS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2018-2019 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is an award in the amount of \$372,723.75 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) through the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management (75%) and a City match of \$124,241.25 from the General Fund GSD (25%) for a Hazard Mitigation Grant project.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program project (the "Project") to acquire and demolish a structure located at 6732 Oakwood Drive, Jacksonville, Florida 32211 (the "Subject Property"). The Subject Property is situated on the bend of the Arlington River at the transition to Pottsburg Creek. Even without severe weather, this area is subject to persistent flooding. Further, this area experienced storm surge during Hurricane Irma, which severely impacted the structure. There are four recorded flood loss claims with FEMA for the Subject Property. The current homeowner filed two of the claims and the owner prior to her also filed two claims. According to a neighbor, the Subject Property also experienced flooding prior to the two most recent

owners. The Project is an acquisition/demolition project that will remove the structure from the threat of future flood damages. Acquisition and demolition is the most effective means to protect against flooding and has been promoted as the preferred method of reducing flood risks. The completion of the Project will reduce future public costs to county, state, and federal agencies that provide, among other things, evacuation and rescue, emergency shelter, and debris removal services. The Project will also remove the current residents from the immediate dangers of flooding. The Subject Property will be returned to green space, thus improving local flood storage and conveyance. Finally, the Subject Property will be deed-restricted so as not to allow a new structure that inevitably would be damaged by future flooding to be built.

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CIP Amendment. Ordinance 2018-505-E, being the Section 3. 2019-2023 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide funding for the project entitled "Acquisition & Demo of Floodprone Property - Oakwood Drive." The project is more fully described in the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Revised CIP, August 19, 2019 -NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference. The Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will delay urgently needed mitigation. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this ordinance requires affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2018-505-In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Ε. Program approved by Ordinance 2018-505-E shall continue in full

force and effect.

Section 4. Authorization to execute. The Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement between the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) and the City of Jacksonville, in substantially the same form placed on file with the Office of Legislative Services (the "Agreement").

Section 5. Oversight. The Emergency Preparedness Division of the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department will provide oversight.

Section 6. Reporting. Consistent with 2 C.F.R. § 200.238, the City of Jacksonville (the "Sub-Recipient") shall provide FDEM quarterly reports and a close-out report. These reports shall include the current status and progress by the Sub-Recipient and all subcontractors in completing the work described in the Scope of Work and the expenditure of funds under the Agreement, in addition to any other information requested by FDEM.

Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
