WHEREAS, EVAC is "CAVE" spelled backwards, and was inspired by Plato's Allegory of the Cave. The Allegory of the Cave is a story of prisoners chained in a cave since birth, but are not aware of the chains or that they are in a cave because it's all they have ever known. In the story, a liberator leads them out of the cave to the light and afterwards it is the liberated prisoners' responsibility to liberate others; and

18 WHEREAS, EVAC is a grassroots movement of predominantly 19 African-American young men, created by Robert E. Lee High School 20 teacher Amy Donofrio and her students. The young men who are a part 21 of the EVAC Movement have channeled personal tragedies, such as 22 losing siblings to murder, having family members incarcerated and 23 witnessing shootings, into positive life changes; and

24 WHEREAS, in the few years since inception, the young men in 25 EVAC as a group have participated in the Coalition for Juvenile 26 Justice National Youth Summit, the US Department of Justice Youth-27 Police Roundtable in Washington DC, and were presenters at a Senate 28 Committee Hearing on Capitol Hill. They have also been presenters 29 at the Harvard University Annual Alumni of Color Conference, and been selected as Harvard Youth Advisors, and were featured on the 30 front page of The New York Times; and 31

WHEREAS, in 2016 the young men in EVAC were honored to meet 1 2 President Barack Obama, Senator Cory Booker and Representative John 3 Lewis. They contributed to the Presidential Youth Justice Proclamation, were presenters at The Ethics Project National Youth 4 5 Summit, and were the National Winners of the Campaign for Youth Justice Social Media Challenge and of Harvard's KIND School 6 7 Challenge; and

WHEREAS, the young men in EVAC have had numerous personal 8 9 achievements despite having experienced traumatic life events. 10 Through the EVAC Movement, they have created a brotherhood amongst themselves, comforted one another in times of crises, and embraced 11 hope for their futures. They have toured college campuses, hosted 12 job fairs at their school, and some have doubled their GPAs. The 13 young men in EVAC have avoided violence and arrest, and have become 14 15 advocates for justice, successfully fighting for a classmate to return to juvenile court to avoid an excessive prison sentence; now 16 therefore 17

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby commends the young men in the EVAC Movement for their outstanding leadership, personal successes, and justice advocacy. City Council also appreciates the dedication of Amy Donofrio for creating the EVAC Movement and supporting them on this journey.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
