A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF ALVIN "PETE" CARPENTER; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Alvin "Pete" Carpenter, a native of Mt. Vernon, Kentucky, attended Transylvania University and graduated from the University of Cincinnati with a degree in political science and began his railroad career in 1962 in Louisville as a brakeman for the Louisville & Nashville Railroad; and

WHEREAS, his career spanned a period of tremendous change in the railroad industry, with scores of small railroads being purchased and consolidated into a few major national carriers, one of which was CSX Transportation. Mr. Carpenter rose through the ranks of the railroad as it grew, moving to Jacksonville in 1988 and eventually becoming President and CEO of CSX Transportation, headquartered in Jacksonville, from 1992 to 1999 and ultimately Vice Chairman of CSX Corporation, the railroad's parent company, until his retirement in 2001; and

WHEREAS, Pete Carpenter was widely known and respected as a leader who could balance the best interests of the company with those of its employees, and who managed a change in the corporate culture to one of shared responsibility and participatory decision—making, guided along the way by his folksy sense of humor and optimism; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his corporate responsibilities, Mr. Carpenter was prolifically active in community and civic affairs, serving on numerous corporate boards of directors, as board chair
