RESOLUTION 2019-423-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING ALL THOSE FIRST RESPONDERS, MILITARY PERSONNEL, MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS, AND OTHERS WHO SPRANG INTO ACTION AT A MOMENT'S NOTICE IN RESPONSE TO A RECENT AIRLINER ACCIDENT AT NAVAL AIR STATION JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on the evening of May 3, 2019, a Miami Air International jetliner chartered to ferry military personnel and civilians from Guantanamo Bay, Cuba to Naval Air Station Jacksonville slid off the end of the runway while landing in stormy weather and came to rest in 4 to 6 feet of water in the St. Johns River; and

WHEREAS, the 136 passengers and 7 crew members aboard the flight, some with minor injuries from the crash, exited the airplane safely and were ferried to shore by Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department and U.S. Navy personnel, and 22 were transported to hospitals for evaluation and treatment of their injuries; and

WHEREAS, while some of the passengers whose final destination was Jacksonville were picked up by family and friends, more than 50 others who were bound for other destinations were housed for the night at the NAS Jacksonville hospital and at a youth activity center on the base and made comfortable with clothing, bedding and food provided by the American Red Cross until they could make other

travel arrangements and continue their journeys over the weekend; and

WHEREAS, the accident generated an immediate and effective response from hundreds of emergency first responders, ambulance and hospital personnel, military personnel, and others, all of whom deserve to be thanked and commended for their quick response and selfless service in a time of emergency; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and commends the hundreds of people who responded instantly and assisted in many ways large and small with the rescue and subsequent care of passengers from a chartered airliner that skidded off the end of a runway at Naval Air Station Jacksonville and came to rest in shallow water in the St. Johns River, and with the subsequent environmental clean-up and recovery of the aircraft.
