Explanation of Appropriation (C)

> The funding above is a grant in the amount of \$25,000.00 from the Christopher and Dana Reeve Foundation and a City match of \$57,850.00 from the ADA funds of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services for adaptive kayak launch at Bethesda Park. The grant period runs from June 1, 2019, through May 31, 2020.

Section 2. Carryover. The funds appropriated in Section 1 of this ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover from year to year until completion of the project.

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to install an adaptive kayak launch at Bethesda Park. The proposed adaptive launching system includes a unique gangway with kayak chute connected to a floating dock with kayak cradle, transition seat, grab bars, and straps to assist the launching of kayaks for people of a wide variety of abilities. In addition, the project will include improvements and expansion of the existing sidewalk, to which the launch system will attach and connect to the existing accessible parking area.

Approval and authorization. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, the Grant Award Letter from the Christopher & Dana Reeve Foundation, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.

the 2019-2023 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to decrease funding for the project entitled "ADA Compliance within Parks/Upgrade Park."
