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## ORDINANCE 2019-611-E

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$12,462,500.00 FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (USDOT) GRANT FUNDING VIA THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (FDOT) FOR ITS PARTICIPATION IN THE PROJECT COSTS TO DEMOLISH A PORTION OF THE ELEVATED, CONCRETE HART BRIDGE EXPRESSWAY AT LIBERTY STREET BETWEEN GATOR BOWL BOULEVARD AND A. PHILIP RANDOLPH BOULEVARD AND TO CONSTRUCT AN AT-GRADE INTERSECTION AT GATOR BOWL BOULEVARD, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 19-113; AMENDING THE2019-2023 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2018-505-E TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PROJECT ENTITLED "HART BRIDGE RAMP MODIFICATION"; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE LOCAL AGENCY PROGRAM AGREEMENT BETWEEN FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THECITY, THEROADWAY TRANSFER AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE,

DUVAL COUNTY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR FURTHER AUTHORIZATIONS TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, ANY AND ALL ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO OBTAIN THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (USDOT) GRANT FUNDING VIA THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (FDOT); PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2018-2019 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

  - (c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is a grant from the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) grant funding via the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to the other construction costs line item for its participation in the project cost to demolish a portion of the elevated, concrete Hart Bridge Expressway at Liberty Street between Gator Bowl Boulevard and A. Philip Randolph Boulevard and to construct an at-grade

intersection at Gator Bowl Boulevard.

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Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to fund the demolition of a portion of the elevated, concrete Hart Bridge Expressway at Liberty Street between Gator Bowl Boulevard and A. Philip Randolph Boulevard and the construction of an at-grade intersection at Gator Bowl Boulevard. The intersection is to include signalization, pedestrian and bike paths, installation of traffic calming improvements, and the construction of a ramp at A. Philip Randolph Boulevard.

Section 3. CIP Amendment. Ordinance 2018-505-E, being the 2019-2023 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide funding for the project entitled "Hart Bridge Ramp Modification." The project is more fully described in the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Revised CIP, September 16, 2019 - NCSPHS" incorporated herein by this reference. The Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral could jeopardize the City's ability to be awarded the FDOT grant funds. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this ordinance requires affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2018-505-In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program approved by Ordinance 2018-505-E shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. Authorization to execute Local Agency Program

Agreement. The Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary

are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of

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the City, the Local Agency Program Agreement between the Florida Department of Transportation and the City of Jacksonville, in substantially the same form placed **Revised On File** with the Office of Legislative Services.

Agreement. The Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Roadway Transfer Agreement between the State of Florida Department of Transportation and the City of Jacksonville, Duval County, Florida, in substantially the same form placed Revised On File with the Office of Legislative Services. The Roadway Transfer Agreement will allow the transfer by Map Transfer of certain right-of-way to the City, after which the City will own, operate, maintain, and repair the transferred right-of-way.

Section 6. Further Authorizations. The Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, any and all additional documents necessary to obtain the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) grant funding via the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) (described in Section 1 above), including, but not limited to, federal and state agreements, contracts, and other related ancillary federal and state grant documents. Any such additional agreements executed by the Mayor shall not obligate the City beyond the grant terms agreed to in this ordinance.

Section 7. Oversight. The Engineering and Construction Management Division of the Department of Public Works will provide oversight.

Section 8. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
