Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2018-2019 fiscal year,

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(C) **Explanation of Appropriation**

an award in The funding above is the amount of \$3,464,850.75 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) through the State of Florida Division of (75응) Emergency Management and а City match of \$1,154,950.25 from the General Fund (25%) for acquisition and demolition of 17 flood-prone structures. All funding for this project will expire February 28, 2021.

15 Section 2. **Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for the Hazard Mitigation Grant 16 17 Program project (the "Project") to acquire and demolish 17 flood-18 prone properties (the "Subject Properties") and return them to 19 green space. The Subject Properties are located within the 100-year 20 floodplain. During Hurricane Irma, this area experienced a storm 21 surge of over three feet, which severely impacted many of the 22 Subject Properties. Even without severe weather, this area is 23 subject to persistent nuisance flooding. The Project will reduce 24 future costs to the county, state, and federal agencies that 25 provide evacuation and rescue, emergency shelter, and debris 26 removal services, and further reduce the financial burden on taxpayers caused by repeated repairs to the Subject Properties, 27 that were built adjacent to the St. Johns River and within the 100-28 29 year floodplain. The Subject Properties will be deed-restricted 11 12 so as not to allow new structures to be built that inevitably would be damaged by future flooding. 13

14 Section 3. Authorization to execute. The Mayor, or his 15 designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Federally-16 17 Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement between the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) and the City of Jacksonville, 18 in substantially the same form placed on file with the Office of 19 20 Legislative Services.

CIP Amendment. Ordinance 2018-505-E, being the 21 Section 4. 22 2019-2023 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and 23 certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide 24 funding for the project entitled "Acquisition & Demo of 17 25 Floodprone Properties." The project is more fully described in the 26 Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference. The Council finds that the 27 2.8 deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget 29 and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the 30 community because such deferral will delay urgently needed mitigation. This area is subject to persistent nuisance flooding; 31

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the Project will reduce future costs to the county, state, and 1 2 federal agencies that provide evacuation and rescue, emergency shelter, and debris removal services, and further reduce the 3 financial burden on taxpayers caused by repeated repairs to the 4 Subject Properties. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, 5 enactment of this ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-6 7 thirds of the Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall 8 9 constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2018-505-E. In all other 10 respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program approved by Ordinance 2018-505-E shall continue in full force and effect. 11

Section 5. Oversight. FDEM will provide oversight.
Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become
effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
without the Mayor's signature.
