AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; APPROPRIATING \$4,619,801.00 (\$3,464,850.75 FROM THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) THROUGH THE FLORIDA DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT (FDEM) AND A 25% CITY MATCH OF \$1,154,950.25 FROM THE GENERAL FUND) UNDER THE HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM TO ACOUIRE AND DEMOLISH 17 FLOOD-PRONE PROPERTIES AND RETURN THEM TO GREEN SPACE, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 19-088; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE FEDERALLY-FUNDED SUBAWARD AND GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN FDEM AND CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; AMENDING THE 2019-2023 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM APPROVED ΒY ORDINANCE 2018-505-E TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PROJECT ENTITLED "ACQUISITION & DEMO OF 17 FLOODPRONE PROPERTIES"; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

## (c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is an award in the amount of \$3,464,850.75 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) through the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management (75%) and a City match of \$1,154,950.25 from the General Fund (25%) for acquisition and demolition of 17 flood-prone structures. All funding for this project will expire February 28, 2021.

Section 2. The purpose of the appropriation in Purpose. Section 1 is to provide funding for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program project (the "Project") to acquire and demolish 17 floodprone properties (the "Subject Properties") and return them to green space. The Subject Properties are located within the 100-year floodplain. During Hurricane Irma, this area experienced a storm surge of over three feet, which severely impacted many of the Subject Properties. Even without severe weather, this area is subject to persistent nuisance flooding. The Project will reduce future costs to the county, state, and federal agencies that provide evacuation and rescue, emergency shelter, and debris removal services, and further reduce the financial burden on taxpayers caused by repeated repairs to the Subject Properties, that were built adjacent to the St. Johns River and within the 100year floodplain. The Subject Properties will be deed-restricted so as not to allow new structures to be built that inevitably would be damaged by future flooding.

Section 3. Authorization to execute. The Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement between the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) and the City of Jacksonville, in substantially the same form placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 4. CIP Amendment. Ordinance 2018-505-E, being the 2019-2023 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide funding for the project entitled "Acquisition & Demo of 17 Floodprone Properties." The project is more fully described in the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. The Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget

and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the 1 2 community because such deferral will delay urgently needed mitigation. This area is subject to persistent nuisance flooding; 3 the Project will reduce future costs to the county, state, and 4 federal agencies that provide evacuation and rescue, emergency 5 shelter, and debris removal services, and further reduce the 6 7 financial burden on taxpayers caused by repeated repairs to the Subject Properties. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, 8 9 enactment of this ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-10 thirds of the Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall 11 constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2018-505-E.
