BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

9 Section 1. Repealing Chapter 27 (Office of Sports and
10 Entertainment), Ordinance Code, in its entirety. Chapter 27 (Office
11 of Sports and Entertainment), Ordinance Code, a copy of which is
12 attached hereto as Exhibit 1, is hereby repealed and reserved in its
13 entirety.

Section 2. Creating a new Part 2 (Sports and Entertainment
Division), Chapter 28 (Parks, Recreation and Community Services),
Ordinance Code. A new Part 2 (Sports and Entertainment Division),
Chapter 28 (Parks, Recreation and Community Services), Ordinance
Code, is hereby created to read as follows:

CHAPTER 28. PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES

* * *

PART 2. SPORTS AND ENTERTAINMENT DIVISION

Sec. 28.201. - Sports and Entertainment; establishment;
functions.

There is created a Sports and Entertainment Division. The division shall be responsible for sports and entertainment activities within the City including:

(a) The Division shall be responsible for overseeing and
 managing sports and entertainment interactions with the City of
 Jacksonville.

30 (b) The Division shall be responsible for identifying sports31 and entertainment opportunities, benchmarking and assessment of

opportunities, ensuring the development of a program design, relationship management, identification of funding mechanisms to support the events, and the tracking of value created through sports and entertainment opportunities.

5 (c) The Division shall be responsible for overseeing the 6 Sports and Entertainment Trust Fund, pursuant to Section 111.155, 7 Ordinance Code.

8 (d) The Division shall be responsible for operating the Office9 of Special Events.

Sec. 28.202. - Division Chief.

The Chief of Sports and Entertainment is the Division Chief of the Sports and Entertainment Division. The Chief shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by the Council, and shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor. The Chief shall have a bachelor's degree or higher from an accredited college or university. The Chief shall possess at least 5 years of professional experience in an executive or management position.

Sec. 28.203. - Powers of Division Chief.

19 The Division Chief shall have and may exercise the following 20 powers:

The Chief shall have the following powers, functions and duties with respect to the City-owned facilities including but not limited to the Vystar Veterans Memorial Arena, the Baseball Grounds of Jacksonville, TIAA Bank Field, The Ritz Theatre, the Convention Center, the Times Union Performing Arts Center, and any other facility assigned to the Chief (collectively hereinafter referred to as the "facilities" or the "facility"):

(a) The Sports and Entertainment Division shall be responsible
for the operation and maintenance of the facilities (whether directly
or through a facility manager retained in accordance with the
requirements and limitations of Chapter 126), and the Chief

Administrative Officer, may, in conjunction with the facilities 1 manager when appropriate, execute fixed dollar amount promotional 2 3 and/or sponsorship contracts and agreements with sponsors, promoters, exhibitors, performers and other persons for the use of the facility, 4 including agreements with renters of the facility to staff and 5 maintain restroom facilities at the facility through contractual 6 7 services, volunteers or through a nominal gratuity system, approved by the officer. A nominal gratuity system would allow the City to 8 9 include parking and/or meals complimentary to the volunteers, 10 pursuant to a budget previously approved by Council. Except for 11 revenue producing events approved by contract, all other use of the 12 facilities shall be reserved to the City.

(b) The Director of Parks, Recreation and Community Services shall participate in and make recommendations to the Mayor and the Council concerning the planning and financing of City sponsored events at the facilities.

(c) The Director of Parks, Recreation and Community Services shall authorize the expenditure of funds lawfully appropriated by the Council for hospitality expenses in the interest of promoting the facility for City-sponsored events and shall comply with expenditures on food, pursuant to § 106.1202, Ordinance Code.

Sec. 28.204. - Special Events

23 The function of the Office of the Special Events is housed within 24 the Sports and Entertainment Division.

(a) The Division of Sports and Entertainment shall be
responsible for the coordination, planning, and implementation of all
Special Events conducted by the City, and implement the provisions of
Chapter 191 (Special Events), Ordinance Code.

(b) The Division of Sports and Entertainment no later than 60
days after the last day of an event, shall deliver to the Director of
Finance and Administration and the Council Auditor a complete

1 accounting of revenues by source, and expenditures by category and 2 source including, but not limited to, General Fund, Trust Fund, and 3 any other funds.

4 (c) There is established a liaison relationship between the 5 Special Events activity and the Downtown Investment Authority Chief 6 Executive Officer. Upon request, but at least quarterly, Special 7 Events shall provide the Downtown Investment Authority Chief 8 Executive Officer information regarding special event permits 9 Downtown.

Section 3. Amending Section 26.201 (Economic Development), Chapter 26 (Economic Development), Ordinance Code. Section 26.201 (Economic Development), Chapter 26 (Economic Development), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

1 Special Events Trust Fund. There is created an account to be (a) 2 known as the Special Events Trust Fund, into which shall be 3 deposited all funds appropriated from time to time by the Council and all event-related monies (which shall include, but not be 4 5 limited ticket sales, donations, to, qifts, sponsorship underwriting fees and event participation fees which are sold by 6 7 the City or given to the City from nongovernmental sources), 8 together with the interest thereon, to assist in defraying the 9 operational and production costs and expenses of City-sponsored 10 or City-cosponsored special events, as such special events are 11 determined by the Mayor or City Council. The Director of Parks, 12 Recreation and Community Services, and the Director of Finance is authorized 13 and Administration and directed to make 14 disbursements from this fund upon the written requisition of the 15 Mayor, or his or her designee, and the Mayor, or his or her 16 designee is authorized to negotiate and execute contracts and 17 agreements with entertainers, promoters, co-sponsors and other 18 public or private parties or entities which are necessary both to 19 outline and define the duties and responsibilities of the City 20 and such other persons or entities and to assure successful 21 special events; provided, however, that the Director of Finance 22 and Administration shall certify on such contracts or agreements 23 that there are current funds available in this trust fund or in 24 the current appropriation to the Office of Sports and Entertainment Division for special events to fund the particular 25 26 special event in question, and provided further that an assistant general counsel in the Office of General Counsel shall approve 27 28 such contracts and agreements as to form. No operating funds may be transferred into this trust fund unless specifically approved 29 by City Council. All event-related monies and interest placed 30 into this trust fund are hereby appropriated for the purposes of 31

this trust fund and such appropriations (event-related monies and City-provided funding) shall not lapse at the close of any fiscal year, but instead shall carry over to the next fiscal year.

The Special Events Office Sports and Entertainment Division, no later 4 5 than 60 days after the last day of an event, shall deliver to the Financial Services Officer Director of Finance and Administration 6 7 (a/k/a the Chief Financial Officer) and the Council Auditor a complete accounting of revenues by source, and expenditures by 8 9 category and source including but not limited to General Fund, Trust 10 Fund, and any other funds, on a form agreed to by the Sports and 11 Entertainment Officer Chief, the Financial Services Officer Director 12 of Finance and Administration/CFO, and the Council Auditor.

Sec. 111.155. - Sports and Entertainment Trust Fund.

15 There is created an account to be known as the Sports and Entertainment Trust Fund, into which shall be deposited funds 16 17 appropriated from time to time by Council and all event-related monies including, but not limited to, ticket sales, donations, gifts, 18 19 sponsorship underwriting fees, advertising charges and commissions, 20 and event participation fees which are sold by the Office of Sports 21 and Entertainment Division or given to the Office of Sports and 22 Entertainment Division from nongovernmental sources, together with 23 interest thereon. These funds are designated to pay commissioned advertising expenses and to assist in subsidizing events and in 24 defraying the direct costs and expenses associated with events that 25 26 sponsored or co-sponsored by the Office of Sports are and 27 Entertainment Division, as such events are determined by the Office 28 of Sports and Entertainment Division. The Sports and Entertainment Officer Director of Parks, Recreation and Community Services, and the 29 Director of Finance and Administration shall make disbursements from 30 fund upon the written requisition of 31 this the Sports and

1 Entertainment Officer Chief, and the Director of Finance and 2 Administration shall make disbursements from this fund upon the 3 written requisition of the Chief Administrative Officer. The Sports and Entertainment Officer Chief shall ensure payment for all direct 4 5 expenses and operating expenses for any Sports and Entertainment Officer Chief requested use of the Facility Venues. Any use of the 6 7 Facility Venues shall require prior to the event either i) City Council approval or ii) certification from the Facilities Manager, 8 9 which shall not be unreasonably withheld, that no direct expenses are being added to the approved budget and being charged as an operating 10 11 expense. The Sports and Entertainment Officer Chief shall approve, 12 after consultation with the facilities manager when appropriate regarding the availability of the venue, all fixed dollar amount 13 14 promotional and/or sponsorship contracts and agreements with promoters, co-sponsors and other public or private parties 15 or entities, and the Chief Administrative Officer is authorized to 16 negotiate and execute such fixed dollar amount promotional and/or 17 sponsorship contracts and agreements, provided, however, that the 18 Financial Service Officer Director of Finance and Administration 19 (a/k/a the Chief Financial Officer) shall certify on such contracts 20 21 or agreements that there are current funds available (i.e. funds are 22 on account at the time of contract execution) in this trust fund to 23 fund the particular event in question, and provided further that an assistant general counsel in the Office of General Counsel shall 24 25 approve such contracts and agreements as to form. All event-related 26 and interest placed into this trust fund are monies hereby 27 appropriated for the purposes of this trust fund and all appropriations (event-related monies and City-provided funding) shall 28 not lapse at the close of any fiscal year, but instead shall carry 29 30 over to the next fiscal year.

The Sports and Entertainment Officer Chief, no later than 60 days 1 after the last day of a sports event where Trust Fund money was used, 2 shall deliver to the Financial Services Officer Director of Finance 3 4 and Administration (a/k/a the Chief Financial Officer), Council 5 Members and the Council Auditor a complete accounting of revenues by source and expenditures by category and source including but not 6 7 limited to General Fund, Trust Fund and any other funds, on a form agreed to by the Sports and Entertainment Officer Chief, 8 the 9 Financial Services Officer Director of Finance and Administration/CFO 10 and the Council Auditor.

The appointed positions of the City within the 10 affected Departments and Divisions are hereby redesignated as the corresponding positions in the new Department or Division, 11 as 12 applicable.

13 Section 8. Codification Instructions. The Codifier is 14 authorized to make all chapter and division "tables of contents" 15 consistent with the changes set forth herein. Furthermore, the Office 16 of General Counsel, working together with and through the contracted 17 codifier of the City Ordinance Code, is hereby authorized and directed to make such editorial changes throughout the Ordinance Code 18 19 reflect the name change from the Office of to Sports and 20 Entertainment to the Sports and Entertainment Division, in regard to 21 all to departments, divisions and sub-titles therein, and to reflect 22 such changes in duties, functions and responsibilities throughout the 23 Ordinance Code resulting from the changes and the restructuring of the Executive Branch of the City government as set forth herein. 24 25 Such editorial changes, and any others necessary to make the 26 Ordinance Code consistent with this legislation, and changes to the Ordinance Code shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are 27 28 discovered.

Section 9. Authorizing the Council Auditor's and General Counsel's Office to make "Technical Amendments". The Council Auditors and the General Counsel's Offices are authorized to take all

1 necessary action in connection with this legislation, to execute the 2 finalization and codification of the legislation to effectuate the 3 purposes of this Ordinance as recommended by the Council Committees and enacted by Council, without further Council action, provided such 4 changes and amendments are limited to "technical amendments" and do 5 not change the fiscal impact and, further provided, that all such 6 7 amendments shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the General Counsel, or designee, and all other appropriate 8 9 official action required by law.

Section 10. Organizational Chart. For informational purposes only for this legislation, an organizational chart is attached hereto as "Revised Exhibit 3, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 3, Rev Org Chart, June 17, 2019 - NCSPHS".

Section 11. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
