5 **RESOLUTION 2019-815**

6 A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING THE  
7 JACKSONVILLE SHARKS ON WINNING THE 2019  
8 NATIONAL ARENA LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP GAME;  
9 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.  
10

11 **WHEREAS**, the Jacksonville Sharks, founded in 2010, are an  
12 Arena Football team playing in the National Arena League (NAL)  
13 since 2017. The Sharks are a perennial powerhouse having won the  
14 inaugural NAL championship in 2017; and

15 **WHEREAS**, the Sharks 2019 team was led by multiple award  
16 winning players, including defensive lineman Nick Woodman who won  
17 the NAL 2019 awards for Defensive Rookie of the Year, Defensive  
18 Lineman of the Year, and Defensive Player of the year; kicker  
19 Brandon Behr who won Special Teams Player of the Year; and  
20 offensive lineman Derrick Zeigler who won Offensive Lineman of the  
21 Year. Additionally, the Sharks' front office and coaching staff won  
22 multiple awards in 2019, including Mascot of the Year, Best Dance  
23 Team, Best Medical Staff, Best Game Operations, Best Fan Base, and  
24 Best Franchise. James Fuller was awarded the Assistant Coach of the  
25 Year Award, and Siaha Burley was awarded the Head Coach of the Year  
26 Award; and

27 **WHEREAS**, the Sharks 2019 season was nearly perfect with a  
28 record of fifteen wins and only a single loss to the New York  
29 Streets in a high scoring game. The Sharks dominance in the NAL  
30 regular season continued into the 2019 playoffs where they defeated  
31 the Columbus Lions with a score of 67-43 landing them a second NAL

1 Championship appearance; and

2       **WHEREAS**, the Sharks faced the Carolina Cobras, a very strong  
3 team, in what proved to be a hard fought NAL Championship. The  
4 Sharks played hard in the first half, but trailed at the start of  
5 the second half by a score of 23-28. The game went back and forth,  
6 and the Sharks found themselves trailing with time running out.  
7 With only eleven seconds left on the clock, quarterback Mike Fafaul  
8 was able to find wide receiver Durrion Neal with a pass in the end-  
9 zone to score what proved to be the game winning touchdown. The  
10 Cobras refused to go quietly and drove their way to the Sharks 6-  
11 yard line before the clock ran out giving the Sharks their second  
12 NAL championship victory; now therefore

13       **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

14       **Section 1.** The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and  
15 commends the Jacksonville Sharks players, Head Coach Siaha Burley,  
16 the coaching staff, front office and the entire Sharks organization  
17 on their outstanding achievement in winning the 2019 National Arena  
18 League championship, and extends its very best wishes for continued  
19 success in the future.

20       **Section 2.       Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become  
21 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective  
22 without the Mayor's signature.
