A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND MANY ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF COACH NATHANIEL WASHINGTON; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Nathaniel Washington, a Jacksonville native, graduated from Old Stanton High School and earned his bachelor's degree at Florida Normal College (now known as Florida Memorial University) and his master's degree from New York University; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Washington enlisted in the US Navy and served in World War II, then after the war returned to Jacksonville to begin a long and celebrated career as a teacher and coach, originally at Matthew Gilbert High School where he coached legendary athlete, Olympic gold medalist and Super Bowl winner "Bullet" Bob Hayes and later at Douglas Anderson High School; and

WHEREAS, while at Douglas Anderson High School, Coach Washington conceived and organized, with the assistance of other local high school coaches and athletic directors and the City's Parks and Recreation Department, the first Bob Hayes Invitational Track and Field Meet. From a modest beginning in 1965 with five local high schools participating, the Bob Hayes Track Meet has grown into the largest one-day outdoor track meet in the country, attracting thousands of athletes from more than 150 high schools and middle schools across the United States, Canada and the Caribbean; and

WHEREAS, in addition to serving 58 years as a teacher and coach, Nathaniel Washington was also the owner/operator of Patti's Daddy's Restaurant and Quik Stop, was Deacon Emeritus of his church, and was a member of the Florida Memorial University Alumni Association, where he formerly served as Trustee and Life Member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, while he is perhaps best known for his role in founding the Bob Hayes Invitational Track and Field Meet, Coach Washington will be most appropriately remembered as an outstanding teacher and mentor who impacted the lives of thousands of young men and women who had the privilege of being the recipients of his wisdom, guidance, and care over the years; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and commemorates the life and countless accomplishments of Coach Nathaniel Washington upon the occasion of his passing and extends to Coach Washington's family, friends and admirers its sincere gratitude. Coach Washington was a towering figure in Jacksonville's educational and sporting history and his contributions will be long and gratefully remembered by all whose lives he touched.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
