A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING DAVAY
KINSEY FOR HER BRAVERY AND RAPID RESPONSE IN
AIDING TWO FIREFIGHTERS WHO WERE ATTACKED AND
SEVERELY INJURED IN THE LINE OF DUTY;
PROVIDING AN EFFCTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Davay Kinsey is a Jacksonville native who graduated from Wolfson High School in 1998. Upon graduation, Ms. Kinsey joined the United States Air Force where she served for eleven years as a military police officer. After leaving the Air Force, Ms. Kinsey started working as a security officer at UF Health Jacksonville, the position that she has held for over a decade; and

WHEREAS, on October 8, 2019, the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department was dispatched on what initially appeared as a routine medical transport call. Engineer Vincent Harper, a ten-year JFRD employee, and Captain Latorrence Norris, a thirteen-year veteran, responded in Rescue 2 to the call and began to transport a 38 year-old male patient to the nearest hospital, UF Health. While on route to the hospital, the patient became aggressive and attacked Capt. Norris. During the struggle, Eng. Harper pulled over the rescue unit and tried to subdue the attacker. During the altercation, both Capt. Norris and Eng. Harper received multiple stab wounds, but Capt. Norris though badly wounded was able to put out a call for help. The Fire Rescue Communications team dispatched another Fire and Rescue unit, contacted the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, and

crucially contacted UF Health to notify them of the situation; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Kinsey, who was on duty during the incident, overheard the distress call on her security radio and immediately sprang into action. She realized that her current location was very close to where the injured Fire and Rescue officers were located. She immediately made her way to the victims on her security golf cart. Upon arrival at the scene, Ms. Kinsey remained calm and assessed the situation. Relying on her Air Force training and experience, she decided that Capt. Norris was in critical condition and needed immediate medical attention. Without hesitation, Ms. Kinsey carefully moved Capt. Norris onto her Security golf cart and drove him to the UF Health Trauma Center which was only a few blocks away; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Kinsey's quick thinking and decisive actions helped to save the life of Capt. Norris. Due to the severity of Capt. Norris' injuries, he may not have survived long enough for the dispatched emergency services to arrive. Ms. Kinsey's eleven years of Air Force training and experiences and ten years of experience working as a security officer at UF Health gave her the skills and mindset to act quickly, effectively, and helped to save the life of one of our local first responders; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and commends Davay Kinsey for her bravery and quick response in aiding two firefighters who were attacked and injured in the line of duty, for her service in the United States Air Force, and for her continued service of helping to keep Jacksonville safe. The City is extremely grateful for her rapid and effective response to the emergency situation.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

without the Mayor's signature.
