ORDINANCE 2019-898-E

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AN ENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT WITH THE LAW FIRM OF SMITH, HULSEY & BUSEY, AS SPECIAL PRIVATE COUNSEL TO THE CITY COUNCIL ON MATTERS RELATED TO THE FUTURE OF JEA; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; WAIVING THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in Ordinance 2019-694-E, the City Council appropriated funds to hire special private counsel; and

WHEREAS, after advertising statewide, receiving proposals and interviewing responding qualified law firms, the Council President, in consultation with the General Counsel and the Director of the Ethics Office, has recommended the following firm; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Authorizing and Approving the Special Private Counsel Engagement Agreement. The General Counsel is hereby authorized to enter into an engagement agreement with the law firm of Smith, Hulsey & Busey to provide special private counsel for the City Council on the matters related to the Future of JEA. A copy of the engagement letter and scope of services substantially in form is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

Section 2. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction

Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon

introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the

emergency is that special private counsel advice is needed on

active propositions on the future of JEA.

Busey has made full disclosure of a conflict of interest existing because of a pending lawsuit in which Smith, Hulsey & Busey represents Continental Holdings, Inc. against both the City of Jacksonville and JEA, the said lawsuit being styled as City of Jacksonville v. Shoppes of Lakeside, Inc., et al., Case No. 3:12-cv-850-J-25MCR, pending in the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Florida. In order to retain Smith, Hulsey & Busey as special private counsel for the City Council, the City Council hereby waives the said conflict of interest per the Florida Bar Rules of Professional Responsibility.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
