5 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$99,262.08 IN CIVIL
6 FINES AND PENALTIES REVENUE FROM THE LITTER
7 TRUST FUND, WITH 70% OF SUCH REVENUE BEING
8 USED BY THE JACKSONVILLE TRANSPORTATION
9 AUTHORITY (JTA) TO KEEP PUBLIC BUS STOPS AND
10 PUBLIC BUS SHELTERS WELL MAINTAINED AND LITTER
11 FREE AS SET FORTH IN WRITTEN CRITERIA ADOPTED
12 BY JTA FOR THAT PURPOSE, AND THE REMAINING 30%
13 BEING USED TO PAY PART-TIME CODE ENFORCEMENT
14 EMPLOYEES FOR PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY ENFORCEMENT
15 AND TO CONDUCT PUBLIC AWARENESS AND EDUCATION
16 PROGRAMS TO ADVANCE ZERO-TOLERANCE FOR LITTER,
17 AS INITIATED BY B.T. 20-035; REQUIRING A
18 REPORT TO CITY COUNCIL; PROVIDING FOR AN
19 EFFECTIVE DATE.

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21 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

22 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2019-2020 fiscal year,
23 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the
24 indicated sum from the account listed in subsection (a) to the
25 account listed in subsection (b):

1 (c) Explanation of Appropriation.

2 The funding above is appropriated from the Litter Trust
3 Fund, Section 111.786, *Ordinance Code*.

4 **Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in
5 Section 1 is to provide for the authorized expenditure of the civil
6 fines and penalties revenue. Pursuant to Section 111.786, *Ordinance*
7 *Code*, 70% (\$69,483.46) of the revenue is to be used by the
8 Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA) to keep public bus
9 stops and public bus shelters well maintained and litter free, as
10 set forth in written criteria adopted by JTA for that purpose. The
11 remaining 30% (\$29,778.62) is to be used to pay part-time code
12 enforcement employees for public right-of-way enforcement and to
13 conduct public awareness and education programs to advance zero-
14 tolerance for litter.

15 **Section 3. Report required.** The Chief of Municipal
16 Code Compliance Division shall make a report annually to the City
17 Council concerning the utilization of these funds, including
18 therein the nature of public awareness and education programs to
19 advance zero-tolerance of litter, the status of enforcement
20 efforts, and staffing levels and needs.

21 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This ordinance shall become
22 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
23 without the Mayor's signature.
