AS PART OF THE 8 KENNEDY CENTER'S "SHIFT: А FESTIVAL OF 9 AMERICAN ORCHESTRAS"; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 10 11 WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Symphony, one of Jacksonville's and 12 13 Northeast Florida's premier arts organizations, was founded in 1949 and for the last 7 decades has produced wonderful music with 14 15 outstanding musicians and music directors for the enjoyment of over 16 250,000 listeners each year; and WHEREAS, throughout its history, and especially in the last 20 17

years, the Symphony has been committed to expanding its community 18 19 outreach efforts, taking the full symphony and many smaller 20 ensembles of various sizes to perform in a wide variety of venues, 21 including schools, community centers, senior communities, and 22 outdoor events in order to introduce the widest range of area 23 citizens to the wonders of professionally performed music, both 24 classical and popular, and especially to introduce children to the 25 joy of listening to and making music; and

26 WHEREAS, SHIFT: A Festival of American Orchestras was created 27 by the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts and 28 Washington Performing Arts to highlight the vitality of American 29 orchestras and to showcase how orchestras are responding to and 30 reflecting their communities in meaningful ways, inside and outside 31 the concert hall. A fundamental belief held by both the Kennedy 1 Center and Washington Performing Arts is that an orchestra's 2 artistic role is to lead and not follow, and that imaginative 3 programming advances, and not just satisfies, expectations. They 4 firmly believe that each orchestra instigates and inspires unique 5 and powerful connections with other organizations throughout its 6 home community; and

7 WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Symphony is honored to be one of four American orchestras selected to participate in the 2020 SHIFT 8 9 Festival and will perform on the Kennedy Center stage on March 24th 10 with a program that includes two pieces commissioned by the Jacksonville Symphony - Celebration by Duke Ellington, which was 11 commissioned for the 150th anniversary of Jacksonville's founding 12 and debuted in 1972, and Bridges by Courtney Bryan, the Symphony's 13 2019 Mary Carr Patton Composer-in-Residence which debuted last 14 15 season; and

16 WHEREAS, the city is immensely proud of the Jacksonville 17 Symphony and this national recognition of its good work, and wishes 18 to extend its congratulations and its best wishes for success in 19 Washington; now therefore
