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ORDINANCE 2020-59-W

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE MEMORANDUM UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE LODGE #5-30 ("FOP") AND THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE CONCERNING SURVIVOR HEALTH CARE COVERAGE FOR OFFICERS DYING IN THE LINE OF DUTY NOT COVERED BY FLORIDA STATUTE; PROVIDING OVERSIGHT BY THE EMPLOYEE SERVICES FOR DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Approval and authorization. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of the City, the Memorandum of Understanding between the Fraternal Order of Police Lodge #5-30 ("FOP") and the City of Jacksonville (the "MOU"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by this reference. The MOU was overwhelmingly ratified by the FOP Police membership on November 13 and 14, 2019.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of this legislation is to effectuate the MOU concerning survivor health care coverage for officers dying in the line of duty but not covered by Florida Statute. This benefit expands the coverage currently provided by Section 112.19, Florida Statutes, which covers only those deaths in

the line of duty stemming from a criminal act, so as to cover those situations in which an officer dies in the line of duty but not as the result of a criminal act. The coverage would remain in effect for the surviving spouse until he or she remaries or becomes eligible for medicare. The coverage would remain in effect for dependent children until they reach 25 years of age.

Section 3. Oversight. The Employee Services

Department shall oversee the project described herein.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
