12 ANTI-VAPING HEALTH AWARENESS EDUCATIONAL
13 CAMPAIGN FOR CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF 21 ON
14 THE CONSEQUENCES OF VAPING, AS INITIATED BY
15 REVISED B.T. 20-042; PROVIDING A CARRYOVER OF
16 FUNDS THROUGH FISCAL YEAR 2021; PROVIDING FOR
17 OVERSIGHT BY THE PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE;

20 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

21 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2019-2020 fiscal year,
22 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the
23 indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to
24 the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The appropriation above comprises of a contribution from a private source in the amount of \$100,000.00 to the Mayor's Education Initiative Trust Fund and a City match of \$100,000.00 from the Reserve for Federal Programs to the Public Affairs Office to implement an anti-vaping health awareness educational campaign for children under the age of 21 on the consequences of vaping.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding to implement an anti-vaping health awareness educational campaign for children under the age of 21 on the consequences of vaping. The issue of vaping by young people under the age of 21 has been assigned by Council President Wilson to a Special Committee on the Opioid Epidemic.

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated in Section 1 of this ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover through fiscal year 2021.

Section 4. Public Affairs Office oversight. The Public Affairs Office will oversee the request for proposal to obtain a responsive bidder to perform the anti-vaping health awareness educational campaign for children under the age of 21.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
