BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Approval and authorization. There is hereby approved, and the Medical Director of the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department (JFRD) is hereby authorized to execute and the City, the Vaccine Administration deliver on behalf of Memorandum of Agreement between the Florida Department of Health and the City of Jacksonville, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by this reference (the "MOA"). The JFRD is required to administer the Hepatitis A vaccine to all uniformed personnel according to the Collective Bargaining Agreement. Pursuant to the MOA, JFRD will receive Hepatitis A vaccine for free from the Florida Department of Health (DOH) if JFRD's Wellness Program administers the vaccine to firefighters. The vaccine will protect firemen from contracting Hepatitis A and incurring medical expenses. JFRD will not incur any costs under the MOA, and there are no matching funds required.

Section 2. Oversight. JFRD shall oversee the project
