RESOLUTION 2020-196

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE NINETEENTH AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, American women protested for equal political rights for decades. The victory was a monumental milestone that ultimately opened the door and made a seat at the table for women. The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States on account of sex, U.S. CONST. amend XIX; and

WHEREAS, the General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC) is an international woman's organization dedicated to community improvement by enhancing the lives of others through volunteer service. GFWC works locally and nationally to bring about positive change with an unwavering dedication to community improvement through volunteer service. Simply put, they impact lives through acts large and small. BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and commends the General Federation of Woman's Clubs Florida - District 4 in their support and acknowledgment of the historical significance of the 100th Anniversary of the Nineteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
