## RESOLUTION 2020-198

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF SAMIR SALAMEH; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Samir Elias Salameh was born in 1942 in Ramallah, Palestine and immigrated to the United States in 1962, settling in Jacksonville and working in a bakery and a convenience store briefly before joining the Salameh family grocery store. Three years later he and his brother Munir Salameh bought the Charlotte Sundries sandwich shop on East 8th Street and bought Colonial Sundries on Hendricks Avenue and began their restaurant empire; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Salameh had a tremendous entrepreneurial spirit and through hard work, in cooperation with his brother Munir and their wives, Suad and Basima, they founded The Sheik restaurant in 1972 at the corner of Main Street and 18<sup>th</sup> Street in Springfield, which was the first in a chain of 10 restaurants operating today across Jacksonville, some owned and operated by brothers and the sons of the founders and others by franchisees; and

WHEREAS, Samir Salameh was a respected and highly visible leader in the community, a member of the Ramallah Club of Jacksonville and of Saint George Antiochian Orthodox Church; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Salameh was the loving and devoted patriarch of a large extended family, bestowing time, wisdom and guidance to his children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews and emphasizing the values of faith, education and hard work to leading a successful

and productive life of service; and

WHEREAS, the Council was saddened to learn recently of the passing of Samir Salameh and wishes to commemorate his life; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and Section 1. commemorates the life and accomplishments of Samir Salameh upon the occasion of his passing, and extends to his family, friends, and admirers the City's heartfelt condolences. Mr. Salameh was a leader in the business and civic communities, and his wisdom and generosity will be long and gratefully remembered by all who knew him.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
